Background: 16 Days of Activism

The 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence Campaign is a global campaign dedicated to ending gender-based violence. It runs each year from the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women on November 25th to Human Rights Day on December 10. Coordinated by the Center for Women’s Global Leadership, the Campaign has

seen over 4,100 organizations in 172 countries participate since 1991.

The 16 Days Campaign is dedicated to:

- * Raising awareness about gender-based violence as a human rights issue;
- * Strengthening local work around violence against women;
- * Providing a forum to develop and share strategies;
- * Demonstrating the solidarity of activists around the world; and
- * Calling governments
