

Shelley Winters plays the factory girl whose dark secret threatens Eastman's professional and romantic prospects. Consumed with fear and desire, Eastman is ultimately driven to a desperate act of passion that unravels his world forever.

A RAISIN IN THE SUN

A Raisin in the Sun is a groundbreaking drama celebrating the human spirit, featuring an electrifying performance by Academy Award winner Sidney Poitier. The Younger family, frustrated with living in their crowded Chicago apartment, sees the arrival of a \$10,000 insurance check as the answer to their prayers. Matriarch Lena Younger (Claudia McNeil) promptly puts a down payment on a house in an all-white suburban neighborhood. But the family is divided when Lena entrusts the balance of the money to her mercurial son Walter Lee (Poitier), against the wishes of her daughter (Diana Sands) and daughter-in-law (Ruby Dee). It takes the strength and integrity of this African-American family to battle against generations of prejudice to try to achieve their piece of the American Dream.

A STAR IS BORN

A friendship develops, before tensions increase as Esther's career takes off while Norman's continues to plummet, as the story moves toward a heartbreaking finale.

ABE LINCOLN IN ILLINOIS

Among the most masterful matchups of actor and role in screen history is this stirring film of Robert E. Sherwood's beloved play taking a thoroughly human look at the early years of the 16th President of U.S.A, with all his frailties and strength of character. Raymond Massey wonderfully plays the future Great Emancipator in a chronicle of his backwoods childhood through his first romance with Ann Rutledge (Mary Howard) to his phenomenal rise to President Elect, besting the great orator Stephen Douglas (Gene Lockhart). Ruth Gordon also does memorable work as the ambitious Mary Todd Lincoln, whose vision of Abe's leadership destiny will not be denied by anyone - including her often reticent husband.

He was where he shouldn't have been and saw what he shouldn't have seen. Now, who will believe the word of a career thief and ex-con? Who will trust Luther Whitney (Clint Eastwood) when he says he saw a woman killed – and that the man responsible for her death is the President of the United States (Gene Hackman). While Whitney becomes the Secret Service's prime target, his relationship with his estranged daughter (Laura Linney) hangs in the balance. Based on David Baldacci's bestseller, it is a constantly spiraling game of cat-and-mouse between Whitney, the local police and the highest levels of Oval Office power.

In this thrilling underwater action adventure, a civilian oil rig crew is recruited to conduct a search and rescue effort when a nuclear submarine mysteriously sinks. One diver (Ed Harris) soon finds himself on a spectacular odyssey 25,000 feet below the ocean's surface where he confronts a mysterious force that has the power to change the world or destroy it.

Where to find your favorite fast-food hamburger in Paris? How many laundry soap packets does a trip to Atlanta require? Ask Macon Leary, whose guidebooks are revered by home-loving business travelers who loathe being in transit. About matters of heart, don't ask Mascon. He doesn't have a clue. At least, not yet. This funny, tender film of Anne Tyler's best seller reteams director Lawrence Kasdan with his Body Heat stars William Hurt and Kathleen Turner as misfiring Macon and wife Sarah, and showcases Geena Davis in her Best Supporting Actress Academy Award winning role of romantically inclined dog-trainer Muriel.

ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN**1960, 107 minutes****Director: Michael Curtiz****Cast: Tony Randall, Eddie Hodges, Archie Moore, Patty McCormack, Neville Brand**

Mark Twain's then, now and forever classic about Huck Finn's runaway journey down the Mississippi and into manhood enjoys one of its best screen adaptations here. Michael Curtiz, legendary director of

Casablanca, pilots this all-family movie whose stars include child actor Eddie Hodges (as the irrepressible Huck) and savvy veterans Tony Randall (as King), Andy Devine (as a circus huckster) and Buster Keaton (as a circus sideman). And Archie Moore, as Jim, the fugitive slave who's Huck's rafting companion... and this appealing film's timeless conscience.

AGE OF INNOCENCE

A ravishing romance about three wealthy New Yorkers caught in a tragic love triangle, the ironically-titled story chronicles the grandeur and hypocrisy of high society in the 1870s. At the center of the film is Newland Archer (Day-Lewis), an upstanding attorney who secretly longs for a more passionate life. Engaged to the lovely but ordinary socialite May Welland (Ryder), Newland resigns himself to a life of quiet complacency. But when May's unconventional cousin returns to New York amid social scandal, Newland risks everything for a chance at true love. The Age of Innocence is a spellbinding portrait of hidden romance and regret. It's a brilliant adaptation of Edith Wharton's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel.

AIR FORCE ONE

The fate of the Nation rests on the courage of one man.

ALL ABOUT EVE

From the moment she glimpses her idol at the stage door, Eve Harrington (Ann Baxter) is determined to take the reins of power away from the great actress Margo Channing (Bette Davis). Eve maneuvers her way into Margo's Broadway role, becomes a sensation and even causes turmoil in the lives of Margo's director boyfriend (Gary Merrill), her playwright (Hugh Marlowe) and his wife (Celeste Holm). Only the cynical drama critic (George Sanders) sees through Eve, admiring her audacity and perfect pattern of deceit.

ALL THE KING'S MEN

1949, 109 minutes

In a bravura performance, Broderick Crawford won the 1949 Academy Award for Best Actor with his stunning portrayal of bull-headed, backwoods lawyer Willie Stark, in this powerful drama about political and personal corruption. A somber but realistic chronicle of raw, brutal power in force, *All the King's Men* is based on Robert Penn Warren's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel of the same name. The story was inspired by the rise and fall of southern bigwig Huey Pierce Long, the infamous "Kingfish" who was Louisiana's governor and one-time senator. Long's cunning tactics of building public works during the depression to serve his own needs more than those of his constituents eventually brought about his own downfall.

ALL THE PRESIDENT'S MEN

In the Watergate Building, lights go on and four burglars are caught in the act. That night triggered revelations that drive a U.S. President from office. Washington reporters Bob Woodward (Robert Redford) and Carl Bernstein (Dustin Hoffman) grabbed the story and stayed with it through doubts, denials and discouragement. 'All the President's Men' is their story. It also explores a working newspaper, where the mission is to get the story – and get it right. Based on the Woodward/Bernstein book, the film won 4 Academy Awards.

ALMOST FAMOUS

Despite the objections of his protective mother, William hits the road with an up-and-coming rock band and finds that there's a lot more to write home about, than the music. Featuring a classic rock soundtrack with music from 'The Who' & Elton John, "Almost Famous" is "an utter delight from the first frame to fade out" and a must-see for every generation.

AMERICAN ANTHEM

Four-time Olympic medalist Mitch Gaylord plays Steve. Janet Jones brings her sharp dance abilities to the role of a floor-exercise superstar.

AMERICAN HUSTLE

American Hustle tells the story of brilliant con man Irving Rosenfeld (Christian Bale), who along with his equally cunning partner Sydney Prosser (Amy Adams) is forced to work for a wild FBI agent Richie DiMaso (Bradley Cooper). DiMaso pushes them into a world of Jersey powerbrokers and mafia that's as dangerous as it is enchanting. Carmine Polito (Jeremy Renner) is the passionate, volatile, New Jersey political operator caught between the con-artists and Feds. Irving's unpredictable wife Rosalyn (Jennifer Lawrence) could be the one to pull the thread that brings the entire world crashing down.

AMERICAN PRESIDENT

Andrew Shephard, the President of the United States is a widower with a young daughter and has proved to be popular with the public. His re-election seems assured, until he meets Sydney Helen Wade a paid political activist working for an environmental lobby group. His relationship with Wade opens the door for his prime political opponent, Senator Bob Rumson, to launch an attack on the President's character, something he could not do in the previous election as Shepard's wife had only recently died.

AMISTAD

In 1839, the slave ship Amistad set sail from Cuba to America. During the long trip, Cinque (Djimon Hounsou) leads the slaves in an unprecedented uprising. They are then held prisoner in Connecticut, and their release becomes the subject of heated debate. Freed slave Theodore Joadson (Morgan Freeman) wants Cinque and the others exonerated and recruits property lawyer Roger Baldwin (Matthew McConaughey) to help his case. Eventually, John Quincy Adams (Anthony Hopkins) also becomes an ally.

ANDROMEDA STRAIN

Joining forces with beautiful Italian scientist Vittoria Vetra (Ayelet Zurer), Langdon follows a centuries-old trail of ancient symbols in the hope of preventing the Illuminati's deadly plot against the Roman Catholic Church from coming to fruition.

ANNE OF GREEN GABLES

A "routine" space flight becomes a desperate battle to survive in this breathtaking adventure of courage and faith. Three astronauts must devise a strategy to return to Earth safely after their spacecraft undergoes massive internal damage.

ARGO**2012, 120 minutes****Director: Ben Affleck****Cast: Ben Affleck, Bryan Cranston, Alan Arkin, John Goodman**

As the Iranian Revolution takes over the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, six Americans escape. Now only one man can get them out from behind enemy lines. Tony Mendez is a brilliant CIA agent who specializes in impossible escapes, but his new plan is a daring as it is desperate. Disguised as a film crew, Tony and the fugitives must hide in plain sight, where the slightest slip-up could end in instant death.

AVATAR**2009, 162 minutes****Director: James Cameron****Cast: Sam Worthington, Zoe Saldana, Sigourney Weaver, Michelle Rodriguez**

From Academy Award winning director James Cameron comes Avatar, the story of a paraplegic, ex-Marine named Jake Sully (Sam Worthington) who acts through a 9-foot-tall avatar that allows him to roam the alien planet Pandora and pass as one of the Na'vi, the blue-skinned native people who would very much like to live their peaceful lives without the interference of the visitors. Although he's supposed to be gathering intelligence for the general who'd like to lay waste to the planet and its inhabitants, Jake starts to take a liking to the Na'vi, especially the feisty Neytiri (Zoë Saldana). Thus as the Avatar, he finds himself torn between the two worlds, in a desperate fight for his own survival & that of the Na'vi.

BABEL**2006, 143 minutes****Cast: Brad Pitt, Cate Blanchett, Gael García Bernal, Mohamed Akhzam, Peter Wight****Director: Alejandro González Iñárritu**

In the remote sands of the Moroccan desert, a rifle shot rings out-- detonating a chain of events that will link an American tourist couple's frantic struggle to survive, two Moroccan boys involved in an accidental crime, a nanny illegally crossing into Mexico with two American children, and a Japanese teen rebel whose father is sought by the police in Tokyo. Separated by clashing cultures and sprawling distances, each of these four disparate groups of people are nevertheless hurtling towards a shared destiny of isolation and grief. In the course of just a few days, they will each face the dizzying sensation of becoming profoundly lost – lost in the desert, lost to the world, lost to themselves – as they are pushed to the farthest edges of confusion and fear as well as to the very depths of connection and love.

Times are tough for cotton-miller Archie (Karl Malden), but at least he has his child-bride (Carroll Baker), who'll soon be his wife in title and truth. The one-year agreement keeping them under the same roof, but never in the same bed, is about to end. A game with a sly business rival (Eli Wallach) is about to begin. The movie is written by Tennessee Williams, based on his play 27 Wagons Full of Cotton.

BEASTS OF THE SOUTHERN WILD**2012-- 93 minutes****Director: Benh Zeitlin****Cast: Quvenzhané Wallis, Dwight Henry**

Newcomer Quvenzhané Wallis is Hushpuppy, the tenacious six-year-old force of nature in an isolated bayou community. When her tough but loving father Wink (Dwight Henry) succumbs to a mysterious malady, the fierce and determined girl bravely sets out on a journey to save him. But Hushpuppy's quest is hindered by a "busted" universe that melts the ice caps and unleashes an army of prehistoric beasts.

BEAUTY SHOP**2005, 105 minutes****Cast: Queen Latifah, Alicia Silverstone, Djimon Hounsou, Jonathan 'Lil J' McDaniel, Andie MacDowell, Kevin Bacon****Director: Bille Woodruff**

When Jorge (Kevin Bacon), the egotistical boss at a posh salon, pushes his star stylist, Gina (Latifah), a hair too far, Gina leaves and opens a beauty shop of her own. It's a rocky road to fulfilling her dreams-- and Jorge does his best to ruin her plans. Inheriting an opinionated group of stylists, a colorful clientele and an attractive upstairs neighbor, Gina proves that you can't keep a good woman down - and you can't keep a shop full of outrageous women from speaking their minds!

BELL JAR**1979, 113 minutes****Director: Larry Peerce****Cast: Marilyn Hassett, Julie Harris**

This stirring drama is based on the internationally best-selling autobiography by renowned poet Sylvia Plath. It is the story of a gifted young poet, Esther Greenwood, whose inner genius has trapped her in a private world of terror. Like author Plath, a suicide victim at the height of her career, Esther can't seem to harmonize all the harsh realities of her life with her own perfectionist thinking. From college, through early job hunting and singles life in New York, we see Esther and her friends coping with the pressures of school, relationships and drugs, until each reaches the final path for their adult lives.

Beyond their delightful battle of wits lies a bigger problem - the skinflint businessman next door (Henry Travers) wants St. Mary's condemned, so he can build a parking lot for

his employees. Only a miracle can save St. Mary's now. How a devilish situation finds a heavenly solution remains to be seen in this captivating family classic.
