Invitation to U.S. Embassy Town Hall Meeting on Thursday, October 28, 2010 at 4 pm

Dear United States Citizens in Cote d'Ivoire,

We invite you to come meet our new U.S. Ambassador, Phillip Carter, and Regional Security Officer, Donald Weinberg, at a U.S. Embassy Town Hall Meeting on Thursday, October 28 from 4:00 - 5:00 pm. at the U.S. Embassy in Abidjan-Riviera Golf. The main themes for discussion concern the current security situation in Cote d'Ivoire during the election period, the Embassy's, and your own, roles and responsibilities in emergency contingency planning. As a courtesy to our French-speaking guests we will provide to the best of our ability interpretation and/or written information in French.

When: Thursday October 28, 2010 from 3:00 to 4 pm. (Doors open at 3:30 pm so guests can be seated by 4:00)

Where: U.S. Embassy Atrium. From the security check point by the consular information booth, you will be directed to the main entrance, past the Marine Guard's booth and straight ahead into the atrium.

Who: All adult U.S. citizens (16 years or older), and current Legal Permanent Residents with a valid green card. For minor citizens, one adult parent or legal guardian of a U.S. citizen-child under 16 will be admitted upon presentation of his/her picture ID, the child's U.S. passport and proof of relationship to the child such as a birth certificate or court decree. We regret that, due to space constraints, only one parent, and no minor children, may be admitted.

Purpose: To discuss the security situation, roles and responsibilities in preparing for contingencies, and to discuss alternate methods of communication.
