SECURITY MESSAGE: EVENTS IN TALLINN ON 26 APRIL 2016

The U.S. Embassy in Tallinn informs U.S. citizens of events scheduled for April 26th in Tallinn in memory of the Bronze Soldier commemorating the unrest following the 2007 relocation of the [Bronze Soldier of Tallinn](#), the Soviet World War II memorial.

Schedule of Events:

1900-1930: Public gathering at Tõnismäe park (blue circle on map)

1930-2000: March/movement to Tatari Street 9, where an individual was killed in 2007 (red oval on map).



Even demonstrations or gatherings intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.
