



NON-IMMIGRANT VISAS

Instructions for Fiancé(e) Visa Applicants (K-1)

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Please read all the instructions carefully. The Consular Section will **not** contact you until you have **mailed all the required documents** listed below. Failure to submit those documents (that apply for your case) will result in non scheduling your interview date.

Before an appointment can be scheduled:

A. The applicant (the person that will be provided with fiancé(e) visa must submit by mail the following original documents:

- ▶ Application Forms:
 - **DS-230** (Application for Immigrant Visas and Alien Registration): Part I (Biographic Data).
 - **DS-156** (Nonimmigrant Visa Application). **Print out 2 (two) copies**, and sign both of them.
 - **DS-156K** (Nonimmigrant Fiancé(e) Visa Application).
 - **DS-157** (Supplemental Nonimmigrant Visa Application). For all **male** applicants, 16 to 45 years old.

- ▶ 1 (one) birth certificate for each applicant. For applicants under 16 years old, the birth certificate should have a photo, too.
- ▶ (Only if applicable for you) If previously married, please include proof of termination of that marriage whether by death or divorce (e.g. death certificate of previous spouse, final decree of divorce, etc).
- ▶ Criminal record issued by the Albanian Ministry of Justice for each applicant age 16 years or over. If the applicant uses more than one name or last name, the record must include all names used.
NOTE: Persons convicted of a crime must obtain a copy of each court record and any prison record, even if the beneficiary has been pardoned or granted amnesty, or the criminal conviction is expunged. Originals of these documents, translated and notarized, will be required at the time of final interview.
- ▶ District Court and Attorney records issued at the city where you have resided in the last six months, for all applicants age 16 or over. If the applicant uses more than one name or last name, the record must include all names used.
- ▶ Military records issued by the Army Recruiting Office, for all **male** applicants age 18 or over.
- ▶ A translated and notarized Police Record from a foreign country for applicant age 16 or over, if the applicant is currently living in that country for more than six months, or if the applicant has previously lived in that country for more than one year. - ▶ A photocopy of applicant's passport (biographic data). The passport must have at least one-year validity beyond the issuance date of the visa.
- ▶ Three color photos 50x50mm, white color background. The photo should have a full frontal view of the face, with the head centered in the frame. The face should cover 50 percent of the photo area. For

http://travel.state.gov/visa/temp/info/info_1287.html. If the requirements are not met, the photo will not be accepted.

Note: Certified English translations must accompany all documents not in English, or in the official language of the country. Translations **must be certified by a competent translator and sworn before a Notary Public**. All certificates must be less than 12 months old when presented on the interview date.

B. The Petitioner (the American Citizen) must submit by MAIL the following documents:

- [Form I-134](#) - original Affidavit of Support, (not photocopy, or by email), for each petition filed, accompanied by a photocopy of the sponsor's U.S. passport or legal permanent resident card, tax returns of the last year, most recent tax year W2s for all jobs held, and a recently issued job letter, or an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) transcript (even if the sponsor filed electronically). To request IRS-generated transcripts or copies of a tax return, visit the [IRS website www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov). This document must be less than 12 months old when presented on the interview date. You can download Form I-134 at: <http://www.uscis.gov/>. - If your income does not meet the requirements of the Poverty Guidelines, established yearly by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) <http://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty/> or, if you are not qualified to sponsor your relative financially, you must find a co-sponsor who can present a signed Form I-134, accompanied by a photocopy of the sponsor's U.S. passport or legal permanent resident card, tax returns of the last year, most recent tax year W2s for all jobs held, and a recently issued job letter, or an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) transcript, in addition to your I-134 Affidavit of Support. If you did not file taxes in the last year, you **must also prepare a signed statement explaining why you were not required to file**. - Evidence of assets if you want to use them to prove your ability to support the applicant financially.
