### Fiancé(e) Visa Applicants

#### Appointment Package for Fiancé(e) Visa Applicants

The administrative processing related to your fiancé(e) visa application has been completed. Your appointment date letter is attached.

All intending immigrants, regardless of age, are required to undergo medical examinations. The complete instructions for these examinations are contained in the attached instructions sheet.

The application fee for the K-1 visa is **\$350.00** or the equivalent in Albanian Leke for each applicant regardless of age. This fee is paid by cash only and is non-refundable.

**NOTE:** Before you appear for an interview, please make sure that you have previously mailed the following documents to our office:

- Form DS 230, Part I;
- Form DS-156 (Two copies);
- Form DS-156K;
- Form DS-157, only for males age 16 - 45;
- A photocopy of your passport;
- Birth certificate for each applicant;
- Ministry of Justice records in current and any former names, including maiden names;
- Attorney and Court records in current and any former names, including maiden names;
- Military records for males 18 years old and over;
- Police record from a foreign country (if applicable), translated in English and notarized;
- Three color photos 50x50 mm;
- Affidavit of support I-134, accompanied by a photocopy of the sponsor's U.S. passport or legal permanent resident card, tax returns of the last year, most recent tax year W2s for all jobs held, and a recently issued job letter.

#### Important:

No assurance can be given in advance that a visa will be issued. A consular officer can make a decision only after your formal application and all documents are reviewed, and that officer has personally interviewed you.

You are advised not to make any travel arrangements for departure from this country, not to dispose of your property or give up your job until the visa has been issued to you. A fiancé(e) visa is usually valid for a maximum of six months from the date of issuance. You must travel and apply for admission to the United States within that 6-month period. This office will make every effort to expedite your visa application on the day of your appointment, but it can be a lengthy process.

#### Important Notice:

Section 203(e) of the Immigration and Nationality Act requires that an intending immigrant pursue his visa application within **one** year from the date he is informed that it is possible to do so. If you fail to do so within one year from the date of the attached letter, your application and any visa petition approved for you will be cancelled.
