1.1 What is GSP?

- ❖ **The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) is a U.S. trade program designed to promote economic growth in the developing world**
- ❖ **GSP provides preferential duty-free entry for up to 3,451 products from 129 designated beneficiary countries and territories**
- ❖ **GSP was instituted on January 1, 1976, by the Trade Act of 1974**

- ❑ The U.S. wants to become a destination for more Armenian exports through stronger trade
- ❑ Our goal is to help Armenia's exporters use GSP to increase trade and to diversify Armenia's exports

1.3 (a) To qualify for the GSP **a product must meet the following** **requirements**

- ❑ Must be a GSP-eligible product**
- ❑ Must be brought into the U. S. directly from Armenia**
- ❑ Must be a product of Armenia**
- ❑ If the product includes imported input, the cost of the local content and processing must equal 35% of the product's value.**

GSP-Eligible Exports

- **Eligible**: manufactured items and inputs, jewelry, electronics, some agricultural products, carpets, some textiles and apparel, chemicals, marble, and minerals
- **Ineligible**: most textiles and apparel, watches, footwear, handbags, luggage, gloves and leather goods



- ❑ How? Importer writes an “A” before the tariff number on Customs Entry Form 7501**
- ❑ If importer forgets, (s)he can apply to U. S. Customs for refund**

1.3 (c) Rules-of-Origin Requirements

- ❑ GSP eligible product must be a product of Armenia
- ❑ If the product includes imported input, the cost of the local content and processing must equal at least 35% of product's value

Imported materials can be counted toward the 35% requirements if it undergoes a double substantial transformation

Step 1

The imported material is transformed into *a new and different material* in Armenia with a new name, character and use

Step 2

The new material must be transformed in Armenia into *a new and finished product* with a new name, character and use

1.3 (d) “Imported Directly” Requirement

- Product must be shipped from Armenia directly to the United States*
- If product passes through any other country(ies) en route to the United States, it must not enter the commerce of the other country*

- Authorization of duty-free treatment under GSP expired on December 31, 2010
- The extension of the GSP was recently signed by President Obama
- The extension of the GSP is effective from November 5, 2011
- It applies retroactively from January 1, 2011 and is valid until July 31, 2013

2.2 (2) Automatic Refund

IF IMPORTERS

- submitted their entries electronically via the Automated Broker Interface (ABI), and
- used the appropriate SPI (special programs indicator) for GSP: prefix “A”, and
- paid duty on GSP-eligible goods

IMPORTERS will receive an automatic refund

IMPORTERS are advised to contact the appropriate port of entry for inquiries about the status of their refunds

2.2 (3) Refund via PSC

For electronic entry summaries where prefix “A” was **not used**, retroactive GSP claims must be made via

Post-summary correction (PSC) if

- ❑ PSC is applicable and
- ❑ Time requirements for PSC are met

is the process by which Customs fixes the final appraisement, classification, and assessment of duties, taxes, and fees on the entry summary filed by the importer (19 U.S.C. 1500)

Under 19 U.S.C. 1514, an importer can challenge a liquidation by filing a protest within 90 days of the date of liquidation

Customs has the authority to re-liquidate an entry after liquidation within the same 90-day period
