Walter Russell Mead is the Distinguished Scholar in American Strategy and Statesmanship at the Hudson Institute, the James Clarke Chace Professor of Foreign Affairs and Humanities at Bard College, and Editor-at-Large of *The American Interest*. From 1997 to 2010, Mr. Mead was a fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations, serving as the Henry A.

Kissinger Senior Fellow for U.S. Foreign Policy from 2003 until his departure. Mr. Mead frequently appears on national and international radio and television programs.

Anneliese Rohrer has had an eminent career as a political journalist in Austria, starting at "Die Presse" in 1974. She has served as the daily's long-time head of the department for domestic politics (1986-2001), senior editor, and head of the international department (2001-2005). Ms. Rohrer has also been a columnist for "Kurier" (2005-2009) and for "Die Presse" (since 2009). In addition, she has been a lecturer at the School of Journalism at FH Wien as well as at the University of Auckland, New Zealand. A former American Field Service scholar in Toledo, Ohio (1963/64), Dr. Rohrer earned a PhD in history from the University of Vienna. She is a recipient of the Kurt-Vorhofer Award for political journalism.
