



Savage writes the internationally syndicated relationship and sex advice column *Savage Love* in *The Stranger*, an alternative weekly newspaper in Seattle. In 2010, Savage and his husband Terry Miller began the “It Gets Better Project” whose mission is to communicate to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender youth around the world that it gets better, and to create and inspire the changes needed to make it better for them.

The It Gets Better Project™ has become a worldwide movement, inspiring more than 50,000 user-created videos viewed more than 50 million times.
