

U.S. Embassy Bahrain
Demonstration Notice 52 – April 17, 2012

Spontaneous demonstrations take place in Bahrain from time to time in response to world events or local developments. United States citizens should keep current with media coverage of local events and be aware of their surroundings at all times. If you encounter a large public gathering or demonstration, depart the vicinity immediately.

- On Tuesday, 17 April:

- At 1600 hours, an authorized demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Al Dair.
- At 1600 hours, a demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Busaiteen.
- At 1630 hours, a demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Malkiya.
- At 2000 hours, a demonstration is planned along Shaikh Isa Bin Salman Hwy near Bilad Al Qadeem and Zinj.

- On Wednesday, 18 April:

- At 1600 hours, an authorized demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Tubli.
- At 1600 hours, a vehicular demonstration is planned along King Faisal Hwy, the Shaikh Isa Bin Salman Expressway, and Airport Ave between the Farooq Junction (former GCC roundabout) and the Bahrain International Airport.
- In the afternoon, an authorized demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Bab Al Bahrain (Manama Souq).

- On Thursday, 19 April at 1600 hours, demonstrations are planned in Juffair and Ghuraifa.

- On Friday, 20 April at 1600 hours, an authorized demonstration is planned in the vicinity of Karranah and Abu Saiba.

- On Sunday, 22 April, a demonstration is planned in the vicinity of the University of Bahrain/Bahrain International Circuit.

****** Demonstrations, coupled with instances of possible sectarian clashes, are possible throughout the week. ******

Some demonstrators have engaged in clashes with the police and continue to employ tactics such as placing debris and oil on roadways, throwing steel spikes and Molotov cocktails. These actions often result in adverse driving conditions, an increased police presence, official checkpoints and significant traffic delays. The Embassy expects these tactics to continue. Please use caution as you drive and plan additional time to arrive at your destination.

Please see below for a map. Areas shaded in red are off-limits to U.S. Citizen Embassy employees and their family members. Areas shaded in blue are off-limits to U.S. Citizen Embassy employees and their family members 20:00 – 04:00.

We remind U.S. citizens that even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. U.S. citizens are therefore urged to avoid the areas of demonstrations if possible, and to exercise caution if within the vicinity of any demonstrations.
