Security Message for U.S. Citizens
Nationwide hartal extended until Thursday, February 5, 2015

(Feb 3, 2015)

The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) has extended the previously-called three-day nationwide hartal through Thursday, February 5. The BNP extended the hartal to protest legal proceedings and threatened arrests of BNP leaders.

A hartal is a mass protest and recognized political method for articulating a political demand. As always, remain vigilant, avoid crowds and be aware of your surroundings at all times. The U.S. Embassy is taking a prudent approach to ensure safety of all employees. The travel of U.S. Embassy employees and their family members is restricted to the Diplomatic Enclave (Banani, Baridhara, and Gulshan) until 6:00 p.m. (Thursday), February 5, 2015. Pedestrian, rickshaw, bicycle and other exposed means of movement during hours of darkness, particularly in the vicinity of Gulshan-2 Circle (DIT-2), is not advised.

Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Bangladesh enroll in the Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) at www.Travel.State.Gov. STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
