




IMPORTANT TRENDS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- Spain is the 5th largest sending country in Europe and is 25th globally. It is also the 3rd most popular destination country for U.S. students studying abroad.
- Over the past five years, there has been an 84% increase in undergraduate study and a 14% increase in graduate study. The number of students exercising their Optional Practical Training option has risen 115% in indicating Spanish students' high interest in internships and employment opportunities.
- As the data shows, Spain's student mobility continues to grow, despite the fact that there has been a 25% decline in the population of youth aged 15-24 over the past 10 years, and an economic crisis.
- The U.S. is the 4th study abroad destination for Spanish students, following the U.K., France and Germany. (Source: UNESCO 2012)
- The EducationUSA Spain fairs will take place for the third year in March, adding Barcelona as a stop this year.
