

E-TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Program Purpose

Under the auspices of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, the Office of English Language Programs offers nine innovative, online, graduate level classes to English teaching professional abroad through the University of Oregon. The E-Teacher Scholarship Program explores nine major areas of the academic specialty of Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL).

In addition to specific knowledge of each of the nine major areas of TEFL, each course introduces participants to the most recent TEFL methods and techniques, engages participants in an innovative distance-learning program, employing the latest in modern technology, and provides participants with direct access to U.S. experts.

Program Conditions

The 10-week courses will be offered in the fall of 2013 and the winter, spring, and summer of 2014, though not all nine courses will be offered each term. Participant costs are covered by the U.S. State Department. This includes tuition and the cost of any course materials sent from the institution, including CD-ROMs and books. Participants who successfully complete the course will receive a certificate of participation directly from the course providers.

Course materials will include, but are not limited to, the following:

- downloadable or posted syllabi, assignments, and course readings;
- asynchronous contact between instructors and participants, between other experts and participants, and among participants;
- lectures via real-time, text, or audio-enhanced text;
- use of a bulletin board to post notes, assignments, feedback, etc.;
- information on additional web-based resources; --Department of State resources for English teachers.

All materials will emphasize a learner-centered approach and will be in English. When possible, courses will integrate appropriate Department of State materials, such as "English Teaching Forum" articles and "Shaping the Way We Teach English". Twenty-six of the top performing and geographically dispersed online course participants will be selected to attend a three-week professional development workshop in the U.S. in the summer of 2014.

Participant Requirements

Candidates for E-Teacher scholarships should be teacher trainers or teachers who are working, or plan to work, with one of the nine subjects covered by the courses. They should be highly motivated individuals who are dedicated both to their own professional development and to sharing the knowledge gained with colleagues through workshops or professional presentations. Candidates should also be committed to fulfilling the program requirements (dedicating on average 8-10 hours of work per week) and completing the course. Qualified candidates should:

- Have the ability to complete academic work at a U.S. university level (an advanced level of reading and writing in English, roughly equivalent to a minimum TOEFL score of 525/iBT 70)
- Have an understanding of English technical terms relating to computers and the Internet
- Have regular access (4-5 times/week) to a reliable, up-to-date computer with high-speed internet connectivity
- Have basic technology skills related to email, internet searches and downloads/uploads, logins/passwords, and e-file use (e.g., pdf, MS Word, Excel). Practical Applications in Listening and Speaking Skills participants require access to real-time tools such as Skype
- Have the ability to type in English well enough to perform online tasks in real-time and submit written assignments in a timely manner
- Have at least 8-10 hours per week to devote to the coursework
- Be a citizen of and reside in the nominating country at the time of the course
- Not hold dual citizenship in the United States
