Security/Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens:

Protests in Brussels

On September 27 and 28, 2014.

The U.S. Embassy Brussels informs all U.S. citizens that protests will occur on September 27 and 28, in Brussels.

Rally in support of animal protection and welfare will take place at Place Albertine / near Central Station on September 27 from 13:30 to 16:00 hours. Approximately 300 people are expected to participate. Belgian police will be present. In blue on map.

Protest in support of democracy in Egypt will take place at Schuman Circle / EU Commission on September 27 from 14:30 to 18:00 hours. Approximately 100 people are expected to participate. Belgian police will be present. In red on map.

March in support of humane treatment of animals will take place, From North Station (route GREEN) to Palace of Justice (BLUE) on September 28 from 13:00 to 17:00 hours. Approximately 5000 people are expected to attend. Belgian police will be present.

March in support of funding for arts and sports will take place From Schuman (via route RED) to Palace of Justice (BLUE) on September 28 from 14:00 to 17:00 hours. Approximately 5000 people are expected to participate. Belgian police will be present.

Demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Belgium enroll in the Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) at <https://step.state.gov/step>. STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.


