Security Message for U.S. Citizens:

Protests in Brussels

June 15, 2015.

The U.S. Embassy Brussels informs all U.S. citizens that following protests are expected in Brussels. Police will maintain order.

On June 15, 2015 from 10:00 to 13:00 hours a Union protest against new retirement plans of the government is organized at Midi Station (in green on map). Approximately 2,000 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

Also on June 15, from 14:00 to 16:00 hours a Union protest march against new regulations for "tourist guides" is organized. The march starts at Schuman Square (in red on map) to Place Luxembourg (in blue on map). Approximately 200 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

On June 15, 2015 from 14:00 to 16:00 hours a protest of the Bangladesh community for human rights is organized at the Place Luxembourg (in blue on map). Approximately 100 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

Demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Belgium enroll in the Department of State's [Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#). STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
