The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC/BOTSWANA) is seeking 2 individuals (1 Gaborone; 1 Francistown) for the position of Laboratory Technician.

BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION:

Perform medical laboratory technician duties in Gaborone; will conduct specific microbiologic and mycobacteriologic tests in the laboratory on clinical specimens collected from patients; process clinical specimens for storage and shipment; maintain a register of patients and test results, record data on designate forms, collect test results from other laboratories and maintain supplies. Liaise with and assist laboratory directors and technicians involved in processing of clinical specimens.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:

--Bachelor's degree or host country equivalent in microbiology, biomedical sciences, medical laboratory technology or medical laboratory sciences required.
--Three years' experience as medical or research laboratory technician with experience performing basic microbiologic or microbacteriologic tests is required
--Level IV English required (fluent both written and spoken).
-- Knowledge of laboratory methods, particularly microbiology and principles, practices and procedures, adequate knowledge of hospital and laboratory operations public health tuberculosis and HIV is required.

-- Must have the ability to process sputum specimens

Must have registration with the Botswana Health Professions Council and a current practice license required.

SELECTION PROCESS

When fully qualified, U.S. Citizen Eligible Family Members (USEFMs) and U.S. Veterans are given preference. Therefore, it is essential that the candidate specifically address the required qualifications above in the application.

ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Management will consider nepotism/conflict of interest, budget, and residency status in determining successful candidacy.
2. Current employees serving a probationary period are not eligible to apply.
3. Current Ordinarily Resident employees with an Overall Summary Rating of Needs Improvement or Unsatisfactory on their most recent Employee Performance Report are not eligible to apply.
4. Currently employed US Citizen EFMs who hold a Family Member Appointment (FMA) are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment.
5. Currently employed NORs hired under a Personal Services Agreement (PSA) are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment unless currently hired into a position with a When Actually Employed (WAE) work schedule.

TO APPLY

Candidates interested in applying for this position must follow the application instructions by submitting an application which contains all of the required information listed below. **Failure to do so will result in an incomplete application which will not be considered.**

4. Candidates who claim US Veterans preference must provide a copy of their Form DD-214 with their application. Candidates who claim conditional US Veterans preference must submit documentation confirming eligibility for a conditional preference in hiring with their application.
