REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS - CONSTRUCTION

A. PRICE

The Contractor shall complete all work, including furnishing all labor, materials, tools, transportation, equipment, supervision and services required under this purchase order for the following firm fixed price and within the time specified. This price shall include all labor, materials, overhead and profit.

B. SCOPE OF WORK

The character and scope of the work are set forth in the contract under Attachment 3, Comprehensive Scope of Work, pages 19-21. The Contractor shall furnish and install all materials required by this contract, except as stated.

In case of differences between small and large-scale drawings, the latter will govern. Where a portion of the work is drawn in detail and the remainder of the work is indicated in outline, the parts drawn in detail shall apply also to all other portions of the work.

C. RESERVED

D. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

The COR, or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect from time to time the services being performed and the supplies furnished to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all supplies are of acceptable quality and standards.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

(1) Substantial Completion

(a) "Substantial Completion" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined and certified by the Contracting Officer in writing to the Contractor, on which the work (or a portion designated by the Government) is sufficiently complete and satisfactory. Substantial completion means that the property may be occupied or used for the purpose for which it is intended, and only minor items such as touch-up, adjustments, and minor replacements or installations remain to be completed or corrected which:

- (1) do not interfere with the intended occupancy or utilization of the work, and
- (2) can be completed or corrected within the time period required for final completion.

(b) The "date of substantial completion" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer or authorized Government representative as of which substantial completion of the work has been achieved.

(2) Use and Possession upon Substantial Completion

The Government shall have the right to take possession of and use the work upon substantial completion. Upon notice by the Contractor that the work is substantially complete (a Request for

Substantial Completion) and an inspection by the Contracting Officer or an authorized Government representative (including any required tests), the Contracting Officer shall furnish the Contractor a Certificate of Substantial Completion. The certificate will be accompanied by a Schedule of Defects listing items of work remaining to be performed, completed or corrected before final completion and acceptance. Failure of the Contracting Officer to list any item of work shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility for complying with the terms of the contract. The Government's possession or use upon substantial completion shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work under the contract.

(3) Final Completion and Acceptance: Definitions

(a) "Final completion and acceptance" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined by the Contracting Officer and confirmed in writing to the Contractor, at which all work required under the contract has been completed in a satisfactory manner, subject to the discovery of defects after final completion, and except for items specifically excluded in the notice of final acceptance.

(b) The "date of final completion and acceptance" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer when final completion of the work has been achieved, as indicated by written notice to the Contractor.

(4) Final Inspection and Tests

The Contractor shall give the Contracting Officer at least five (5) days advance written notice of the date when the work will be fully completed and ready for final inspection and tests. Final inspection and tests will be started not later than the date specified in the notice unless the Contracting Officer determines that the work is not ready for final inspection and so informs the Contractor.

(5) Final Acceptance

If the Contracting Officer is satisfied that the work under the contract is complete (with the exception of continuing obligations), the Contracting Officer shall issue to the Contractor a notice of final acceptance and make final payment upon:

- satisfactory completion of all required tests,
- a final inspection that all items by the Contracting Officer listed in the Schedule of Defects have been completed or corrected and that the work is finally complete (subject to the discovery of defects after final completion), and
- submittal by the Contractor of all documents and other items required upon completion of the work, including a final request for payment (Request for Final Acceptance).

E. DELIVERIES OR PERFORMANCE

(1) 52.211-10 COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION, AND COMPLETION OF WORK (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to:

- (a) commence work under this contract within **5 calendar days** after the date the Contractor receives the notice to proceed,
- (b) prosecute the work diligently, and,
- (c) complete the entire work ready for use not later than **60 calendar days** after receipt of the Notice to Proceed (NTP).

The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises and completion of punch list items.

(2) 52.211-12 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES - CONSTRUCTION (SEP 2000)

(a) If the Contractor fails to complete the work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the Government in the amount of **\$135.00 for each calendar day of delay** until the work is completed or accepted.

(b) If the Government terminates the Contractor's right to proceed, liquidated damages will continue to accrue until the work is completed. These liquidated damages are in addition to excess costs of repurchase under the Default clause.

(3) CONTRACTOR'S SUBMISSION OF CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULES

(a) The time for submission of the schedules referenced in FAR 52.236-15, "Schedules for Construction Contracts", paragraph (a), is hereby modified to reflect the due date for submission as **"ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the Notice of Award"**.

(b) These schedules shall include the time by which shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals required by the contract will be submitted for approval.

(c) The Contractor shall revise such schedules (1) to account for the actual progress of the work, (2) to reflect approved adjustments in the performance schedule, and (3) as required by the Contracting Officer to achieve coordination with work by the Government and any separate contractors used by the Government. The Contractor shall submit a schedule, which sequences work so as to minimize disruption at the job site.

(d) All deliverables shall be in the English language and any system of dimensions (English or metric) shown shall be consistent with that used in the contract. No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Government in approving such deliverables if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required by the contract.

(e) Acceptance of Schedule: When the Government has accepted any time schedule; it shall be binding upon the Contractor. The completion date is fixed and may be extended only by a written contract modification signed by the Contracting Officer. Acceptance or approval of any schedule or revision thereof by the Government shall not:

- (1) Extend the completion date or obligate the Government to do so,
- (2) Constitute acceptance or approval of any delay, or
- (3) Excuse the Contractor from or relieve the Contractor of its obligation to maintain the progress of the work and achieve final completion by the established completion date.

(4) Notice of Delay

If the Contractor receives a notice of any change in the work, or if any other conditions arise which are likely to cause or are actually causing delays which the Contractor believes may result in late completion of the project, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's notice shall state the

effect, if any, of such change or other conditions upon the approved schedule, and shall state in what respects, if any, the relevant schedule or the completion date should be revised. The Contractor shall give such notice promptly, not more than ten (10) days after the first event giving rise to the delay or prospective delay. Only the Contracting Officer may make revisions to the approved time schedule.

(5) Notice to Proceed

(a) After receiving and accepting any bonds or evidence of insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide the Contractor a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the time period established in the contract.

(b) It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before receipt and acceptance of any bonds or evidence of insurance. Issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required bonds or insurance certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

(6) Working Hours

All work shall be performed from Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. excluding official Canadian and American holidays. Other hours, if requested by the Contractor, may be approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). The Contractor shall give at least two (2) calendar days in advance to the COR who will consider any deviation from the hours identified above. Changes in work hours, initiated by the Contractor, will not be a cause for a price increase. The Government reserves the right to temporarily or permanently cancel permission to work outside regular hours.

(7) Preconstruction Conference

A preconstruction conference will be held within 5 calendar days after contract award to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that effect construction progress. See FAR 52.236-26, Preconstruction Conference.

F. ADMINISTRATIVE DATA

(1) 652.242-70 CONTRACTING OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVE (COR) (AUG 1999)

(a) The Contracting Officer may designate in writing one or more Government employees, by name or position title, to take action for the Contracting Officer under this contract. Each designee shall be identified as a Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Such designation(s) shall specify the scope and limitations of the authority so delegated; provided, that the designee shall not change the terms or conditions of the contract, unless the COR is a warranted Contracting Officer and this authority is delegated in the designation.

(b) The COR for this contract is the **Maintenance Foreman**.

(2) Payment: The Contractor's attention is directed to Section H, 52.232-5, "Payments Under Fixed-Price Construction Contracts". The following elaborates on the information contained in that clause.

Requests for payment, may be made no more frequently than monthly. Payment requests shall cover the value of labor and materials completed and in place, including a prorated portion of overhead and profit.

After receipt of the Contractor's request for payment, and on the basis of an inspection of the work, the Contracting Officer shall make a determination as to the amount, which is then due. If the Contracting Officer does not approve payment of the full amount applied for, less the retainage allowed by in 52.232-5, the Contracting Officer shall advise the Contractor as to the reasons. Advance payment is not authorized.

The Contractor shall address invoices to: **U.S. Embassy P.O. Box 866, Station B, Ottawa, ON K1P 5T1, Attention: GSO/Procurement Office.**

Under the authority of 52.232-27(a), the 14 day period identified in FAR 52.232-27(a)(1)(i)(A) is hereby changed to 30 days.

The contractor shall show applicable tax as a separate item on invoices submitted for payment.

G. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

(1) Performance/Payment Protection

The Contractor shall furnish some form of payment protection or security approved by the Government, such as letter of credit/guaranty shown in Section I, Attachment 1, in the amount of 50% of the contract price in Canadian dollars.

The Contractor shall provide the information required by the paragraph above within ten (10) calendar days after award. Failure to timely submit the required security may result in rescinding or termination of the contract by the Government. If the contract is terminated, the Contractor will be liable for those costs as described in FAR 52.249-10, Default (Fixed-Price Construction), which is included in this purchase order.

The bonds or alternate performance security shall guarantee the Contractor's execution and completion of the work within the contract time. This security shall also guarantee the correction of any defects after completion, the payment of all wages and other amounts payable by the Contractor under its subcontracts or for labor and materials, and the satisfaction or removal of any liens or encumbrances placed on the work.

The required securities shall remain in effect in the full amount required until final acceptance of the project by the Government. Upon final acceptance, the penal sum of the performance security shall be reduced to 10% of the contract price. The security shall remain in effect for one year after the date of final completion and acceptance, and the Contractor shall pay any premium required for the entire period of coverage.

(2) Insurance

The Contractor is required by FAR 52.228-5, "Insurance - Work on a Government Installation" to provide whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall at its own expense provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts:

General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

1. Bodily Injury on or off the site stated in Canadian Dollars:

2. Property Damage on or off the site in Canadian Dollars:

The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising therefrom, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

(3) Document Descriptions

Supplemental Documents: The Contracting Officer shall furnish from time to time such detailed drawings and other information as is considered necessary, in the opinion of the Contracting Officer, to interpret, clarify, supplement, or correct inconsistencies, errors or omissions in the contract documents, or to describe minor changes in the work not involving an increase in the contract price or extension of the contract time. The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the supplemental documents, and unless prompt objection is made by the Contractor within 20 days, their issuance shall not provide for any claim for an increase in the contract price or an extension of contract time.

(4) Record Documents. The Contractor shall maintain at the project site:

- (a) a current marked set of contract drawings and specifications indicating all interpretations and clarification, contract modifications, change orders, or any other departure from the contract requirements approved by the Contracting Officer; and,
- (b) a complete set of record shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals as approved by the Contracting Officer.

(5) "As-Built" Documents: After final completion of the work, but before final acceptance thereof, the Contractor shall provide:

- (a) a complete set of "as-built" drawings, based upon the record set of drawings, marked to show the details of construction as actually accomplished; and,
- (b) record shop drawings and other submittals, in the number and form as required by the specifications.

(6) Laws and Regulations

The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, including those of the host country, and with the lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Any required permits (including building permits, noise permits, etc.) are the responsibility of the contractor. Host country authorities may not enter the construction site without the permission of the Contracting Officer. Unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall comply with the more stringent of the requirements of such laws, regulations and orders and of the contract. In the event of a conflict between the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the Contractor shall promptly advise

the Contracting Officer of the conflict and of the Contractor's proposed course of action for resolution by the Contracting Officer.

The Contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, to the extent that such compliance is not inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

The Contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all requisite licenses and permits.

The Contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer of compliance with this clause.

(7) Construction Personnel

The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The Contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing, that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

After receipt of the Notice of Award, the Contractor has ten (10) calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer the following requirements for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks: (1) list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project, and (2) completed Authority for Release Information of each personnel. The Contractor shall use the form provided under Section I, Attachment 5.

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or resubmittal of the application.

Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This badge may be revoked at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

The Contractor shall provide an English speaking supervisor on site at all times. This position is considered as key personnel under this purchase order.

(8) Materials and Equipment

All materials and equipment incorporated into the work shall be new and for the purpose intended, unless otherwise specified. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner that will withstand inspection by the Contracting Officer.

(9) Special Warranties

Any special warranties that may be required under the contract shall be subject to the stipulations set forth in 52.246-21, "Warranty of Construction", as long as they are not in conflict.

ATTACHMENT 3

COMPREHENSIVE SCOPE OF WORK ASBESTOS ABATEMENT PROJECT U.S. Ambassador's Residence 500 Lisgar Road, Ottawa, Ontario

1.0. SUMMARY OF WORK:

- 1.0. The Contractor shall remove all asbestos on the area specified in Attachment 4, Drawing. The area shall be approximately 2.3 SQM of asbestos contained plaster to remove on each side of the wall at the US Government owned property known as "the Ambassador's Residence".

2.0 GENERAL:

- 2.1. The Contractor shall have sited visited the residence, taken all measurements and thoroughly understands the requirements of this abatement project prior to submitting his/her bid proposal.
- 2.2. The work shall be accomplished in a manner that conforms with the intent of all applicable U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) laws and regulations pertaining to asbestos abatement, recognizes and takes all precautions against documented biological dangers of airborne asbestos fibers, causes no contamination to other parts of the building, endangers none of the building occupants or workers during abatement, and leaves the areas safe for re-occupancy.
- 2.3. Abatement personnel shall, at all times, wear properly fitted National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) approved HEPA (high efficiency air particulate) filtered half-faced respiratory protection equipment while performing work in the upper and lower attics.
- 2.4. Toxic and/or obnoxious smelling adhesives or compounds shall not be used. The Contractor shall submit Material Safety Data Sheets for adhesives or compounds, for approval prior to application.
- 2.5. Care shall be exercised so as not to damage electrical, plumbing, gas, phone, computer line or other unspecified conduits in the space.
- 2.6. Abatement activities shall be confined within the designated work areas to minimize inconvenience or disruption to the inhabitants of this residence.
- 2.7. The Contractor is solely responsible for all materials, equipment, applicable disposal permits, personal protective equipment in performance of this asbestos removal project.

- 2.8 The Contractor shall coordinate with the COR of the shutting down any service (heating, air conditioning, etc.) in advance in order to coordinate with occupants of this residence..
- 2.9. Entrances to the work area shall be barricaded and posted with conspicuous “DANGER ASBESTOS” signs.
- 2.10. If there are no electrical outlets within the work site the Contractor shall provide electricity via power cords connected to the closest electrical outlets.
- 2.11. As required, the Contractor shall provide water supply via hoses with watertight couplings connected to the faucets in the bathrooms or outside spigots. If not available, hoses shall be connected to the closest faucet in the building.
- 2.12. Work Schedule: The work shall be scheduled around any and all events which occur in this representational residence. The Contractor **MUST CLEARLY UNDERSTAND** this scheduling can change at any moment and upon acceptance of this contract, he/she has shall accommodate him/herself to these changes..
- 2.13. Project Duration: The site work shall not exceed 10 calendar days.

3.0. **ASBESTOS ABATEMENT:**

Area Preparation and Isolation:

- 3.1 Electrical switches and electrical boxes which are located in the work area that are not needed to perform the work, shall be locked out/tagged and pre-cleaned using HEPA filtered vacuum cleaners and wrapped with two (2) layers of 6-mil plastic sheeting and duct tape.
- 3.2 Mechanical and electrical equipment and all other stationary objects in the work area shall be pre-cleaned using HEPA filtered vacuum cleaners, wet wiped, as appropriate, and shall be wrapped with two layers of 6-mil plastic sheeting and duct tape.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall construct full enclosure under negative air pressure.
- 3.4 Decontamination Facility: The Contractor shall provide full decontamination facility contiguous to the work area. The facility shall consist of clean room, shower room and dirty room.
- 3.5 Pressure Differential System: The Contractor shall install air filtration equipment (AFE) inside the enclosure, capable of providing four (4) air exchanges per hours and constant minimum pressure differential of not less than -0.02 inches water column relative to the air pressure outside the enclosure. The system shall be vented, at all possible, outside the building through HEPA filters and plastic tubing or aluminum ducting. The Contractor shall provide a manometer, with printer, to record negative pressure inside throughout the abatement.

Asbestos Removal:

- 3.6 Dusts and debris, throughout shall be removed using HEPA filtered vacuum cleaners. Air inside the enclosure shall be constantly misted with amended water.
- 3.7 Bulk asbestos waste material, dust and debris shall be placed inside 6-mil plastic asbestos waste bags. Plastic bags, containing asbestos wastes, shall be sealed with duct tape and removed from the enclosure at the end of each shift. Waste bags shall be stockpiled in a Contractor-provided approved asbestos container in a COR designated location while waiting for disposal. This container shall be clearly marker with “DANGER-ASBESTOS” signed and shall be lockable.

Final Cleaning and Encapsulation and Enclosure Teardown:

- 3.8 Final Cleaning: After bulk removal of asbestos, final cleaning of surfaces inside the enclosure shall be performed to remove any residual dusts and debris.
- 3.9 Encapsulation: After successful final visual inspection, by the COR, all surfaces in the enclosure shall be encapsulated with EPA approved lock down compound.
- 3.10 Enclosure Tear Down: Tear down enclosure if results of the phase contrast microscopy (PCM) of final air samples were below or equal 0.01 fiber per cubic centimeters (f/cc) of air, EPA “clean air criteria after asbestos abatement. If test results were above the detection limit, the enclosure shall be re-cleaned and air re-tested before enclosure tear down.

4.0. ASBESTOS WASTE DISPOSAL

- 4.1. The Contractor is responsible for transport and disposal of asbestos waste to licensed local hazardous waste disposal site in accordance with U.S. EPA regulations or local regulations, which ever are more stringent. The Contractor shall submit waste transportation and disposal manifests to the COR as part of the project final submittals.
