**A. PRICE**

The Contractor shall complete all work, including furnishing all labor, materials, tools, transportation, equipment, supervision and services required under this purchase order for the following firm fixed price and within the time specified. This price shall include all labor, materials, overhead and profit.

**B. SCOPE OF WORK**

The character and scope of the work are set forth in the contract under Attachment 3, Specification. The Contractor shall furnish and install all materials required by this contract, except as stated.

In case of differences between small and large-scale drawings, the latter will govern. Where a portion of the work is drawn in detail and the remainder of the work is indicated in outline, the parts drawn in detail shall apply also to all other portions of the work.

**C. PACKAGING AND MARKING - Reserved**

**D. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE**

The COR, or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect from time to time the services being performed and the supplies furnished to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all supplies are of acceptable quality and standards.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

(1) Substantial Completion

(a) "Substantial Completion" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined and certified by the Contracting Officer in writing to the Contractor, on which the work (or a portion designated by the Government) is sufficiently complete and satisfactory. Substantial completion means that the property may be occupied or used for the purpose for which it is intended, and only minor items such as touch-up, adjustments, and minor replacements or installations remain to be completed or corrected which:

- (1) do not interfere with the intended occupancy or utilization of the work, and
- (2) can be completed or corrected within the time period required for final completion.

(b) The "date of substantial completion" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer or authorized Government representative as of which substantial completion of the work has been achieved.

(2) Use and Possession upon Substantial Completion

The Government shall have the right to take possession of and use the work upon substantial completion. Upon notice by the Contractor that the work is substantially complete (a Request for

Substantial Completion) and an inspection by the Contracting Officer or an authorized Government representative (including any required tests), the Contracting Officer shall furnish the Contractor a Certificate of Substantial Completion. The certificate will be accompanied by a Schedule of Defects listing items of work remaining to be performed, completed or corrected before final completion and acceptance. Failure of the Contracting Officer to list any item of work shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility for complying with the terms of the contract. The Government's possession or use upon substantial completion shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work under the contract.

(3) Final Completion and Acceptance: Definitions

(a) "Final completion and acceptance" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined by the Contracting Officer and confirmed in writing to the Contractor, at which all work required under the contract has been completed in a satisfactory manner, subject to the discovery of defects after final completion, and except for items specifically excluded in the notice of final acceptance.

(b) The "date of final completion and acceptance" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer when final completion of the work has been achieved, as indicated by written notice to the Contractor.

(4) Final Inspection and Tests

The Contractor shall give the Contracting Officer at least five (5) days advance written notice of the date when the work will be fully completed and ready for final inspection and tests. Final inspection and tests will be started not later than the date specified in the notice unless the Contracting Officer determines that the work is not ready for final inspection and so informs the Contractor.

(5) Final Acceptance

If the Contracting Officer is satisfied that the work under the contract is complete (with the exception of continuing obligations), the Contracting Officer shall issue to the Contractor a notice of final acceptance and make final payment upon:

- satisfactory completion of all required tests,
- a final inspection that all items by the Contracting Officer listed in the Schedule of Defects have been completed or corrected and that the work is finally complete (subject to the discovery of defects after final completion), and
- submittal by the Contractor of all documents and other items required upon completion of the work, including a final request for payment (Request for Final Acceptance).

## **E. DELIVERIES OR PERFORMANCE**

### (1) 52.211-10 COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION, AND COMPLETION OF WORK (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to:

- (a) commence work under this contract within **10 calendar days** after the date the Contractor receives the notice to proceed,
- (b) prosecute the work diligently, and,
- (c) complete the entire work ready for use not later than **10 calendar days** after receipt of the Notice to Proceed (NTP).

The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises and completion of punch list items.

### (2) 52.211-12 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES - CONSTRUCTION (SEP 2000)

(a) If the Contractor fails to complete the work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the Government in the amount of **\$135.00 for each calendar day of delay** until the work is completed or accepted.

(b) If the Government terminates the Contractor's right to proceed, liquidated damages will continue to accrue until the work is completed. These liquidated damages are in addition to excess costs of repurchase under the Default clause.

### (3) CONTRACTOR'S SUBMISSION OF CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULES

(a) The time for submission of the schedules referenced in FAR 52.236-15, "Schedules for Construction Contracts", paragraph (a), is hereby modified to reflect the due date for submission as **"ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the Notice of Award"**.

(b) These schedules shall include the time by which shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals required by the contract will be submitted for approval.

(c) The Contractor shall revise such schedules (1) to account for the actual progress of the work, (2) to reflect approved adjustments in the performance schedule, and (3) as required by the Contracting Officer to achieve coordination with work by the Government and any separate contractors used by the Government. The Contractor shall submit a schedule, which sequences work so as to minimize disruption at the job site.

(d) All deliverables shall be in the English language and any system of dimensions (English or metric) shown shall be consistent with that used in the contract. No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Government in approving such deliverables if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required by the contract.

(e) Acceptance of Schedule: When the Government has accepted any time schedule; it shall be binding upon the Contractor. The completion date is fixed and may be extended only by a written contract modification signed by the Contracting Officer. Acceptance or approval of any schedule or revision thereof by the Government shall not:

- (1) Extend the completion date or obligate the Government to do so,
- (2) Constitute acceptance or approval of any delay, or
- (3) Excuse the Contractor from or relieve the Contractor of its obligation to maintain the progress of the work and achieve final completion by the established completion date.

(4) Notice of Delay

If the Contractor receives a notice of any change in the work, or if any other conditions arise which are likely to cause or are actually causing delays which the Contractor believes may result in late completion of the project, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's notice shall state the

effect, if any, of such change or other conditions upon the approved schedule, and shall state in what respects, if any, the relevant schedule or the completion date should be revised. The Contractor shall give such notice promptly, not more than ten (10) days after the first event giving rise to the delay or prospective delay. Only the Contracting Officer may make revisions to the approved time schedule.

(5) Notice to Proceed

(a) After receiving and accepting any bonds or evidence of insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide the Contractor a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the time period established in the contract.

(b) It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before receipt and acceptance of any bonds or evidence of insurance. Issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required bonds or insurance certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

(6) Working Hours

All work shall be performed during regular working hours Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. or after hours including official Canadian and American holidays. All planned work hours shall be submitted to and approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) one week prior to the planned work. The Government reserves the right to temporarily or permanently cancel permission to work outside regular hours or request alternate proposals for dates when work can be completed.

(7) Preconstruction Conference

A preconstruction conference will be held within 5 calendar days after contract award to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that effect construction progress. See FAR 52.236-26, Preconstruction Conference.

**F. ADMINISTRATIVE DATA**

(1) 652.242-70 CONTRACTING OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVE (COR) (AUG 1999)

(a) The Contracting Officer may designate in writing one or more Government employees, by name or position title, to take action for the Contracting Officer under this contract. Each designee shall be identified as a Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Such designation(s) shall specify the scope and limitations of the authority so delegated; provided, that the designee shall not change the terms or conditions of the contract, unless the COR is a warranted Contracting Officer and this authority is delegated in the designation.

(b) The COR for this contract is the **Facility Management Specialist**.

(2) Payment: The Contractor's attention is directed to Section H, 52.232-5, "Payments Under Fixed-Price Construction Contracts". The following elaborates on the information contained in that clause.

Requests for payment, may be made no more frequently than monthly. Payment requests shall cover the value of labor and materials completed and in place, including a prorated portion of overhead and profit.

After receipt of the Contractor's request for payment, and on the basis of an inspection of the work, the Contracting Officer shall make a determination as to the amount, which is then due. If the Contracting Officer does not approve payment of the full amount applied for, less the retainage allowed by in 52.232-5, the Contracting Officer shall advise the Contractor as to the reasons. Advance payment is not authorized.

The Contractor shall address invoices to: **U.S. Embassy P.O. Box 866, Station B, Ottawa, ON K1P 5T1, Attention: GSO/Procurement Office.**

Under the authority of 52.232-27(a), the 14 day period identified in FAR 52.232-27(a)(1)(i)(A) is hereby changed to 30 days.

The contractor shall show applicable tax as a separate item on invoices submitted for payment.

## G. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

### (1) Performance/Payment Protection

The Contractor shall furnish some form of payment protection or security approved by the Government, such as letter of credit/guaranty shown in Section I, Attachment 1, in the amount of 50% of the contract price in Canadian dollars.

The Contractor shall provide the information required by the paragraph above within ten (10) calendar days after award. Failure to timely submit the required security may result in rescinding or termination of the contract by the Government. If the contract is terminated, the Contractor will be liable for those costs as described in FAR 52.249-10, Default (Fixed-Price Construction), which is included in this purchase order.

The bonds or alternate performance security shall guarantee the Contractor's execution and completion of the work within the contract time. This security shall also guarantee the correction of any defects after completion, the payment of all wages and other amounts payable by the Contractor under its subcontracts or for labor and materials, and the satisfaction or removal of any liens or encumbrances placed on the work.

The required securities shall remain in effect in the full amount required until final acceptance of the project by the Government. Upon final acceptance, the penal sum of the performance security shall be reduced to 10% of the contract price. The security shall remain in effect for one year after the date of final completion and acceptance, and the Contractor shall pay any premium required for the entire period of coverage.

### (2) Insurance

The Contractor is required by FAR 52.228-5, "Insurance - Work on a Government Installation" to provide whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall at its own expense provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts:

General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

#### 1. Bodily Injury on or off the site stated in Canadian Dollars:

The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising therefrom, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

(3) Document Descriptions

Supplemental Documents: The Contracting Officer shall furnish from time to time such detailed drawings and other information as is considered necessary, in the opinion of the Contracting Officer, to interpret, clarify, supplement, or correct inconsistencies, errors or omissions in the contract documents, or to describe minor changes in the work not involving an increase in the contract price or extension of the contract time. The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the supplemental documents, and unless prompt objection is made by the Contractor within 20 days, their issuance shall not provide for any claim for an increase in the contract price or an extension of contract time.

(4) Record Documents. The Contractor shall maintain at the project site:

- (a) a current marked set of contract drawings and specifications indicating all interpretations and clarification, contract modifications, change orders, or any other departure from the contract requirements approved by the Contracting Officer; and,
- (b) a complete set of record shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals as approved by the Contracting Officer.

(5) "As-Built" Documents: After final completion of the work, but before final acceptance thereof, the Contractor shall provide:

- (a) a complete set of "as-built" drawings, based upon the record set of drawings, marked to show the details of construction as actually accomplished; and,
- (b) record shop drawings and other submittals, in the number and form as required by the specifications.

(6) Laws and Regulations

The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, including those of the host country, and with the lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Any required permits (including building permits, noise permits, etc.) are the responsibility of the contractor.

Host country authorities may not enter the construction site without the permission of the Contracting Officer. Unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall comply with the more stringent of the requirements of such laws, regulations and orders and of the contract. In the event of a conflict between the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the Contractor shall promptly advise

the Contracting Officer of the conflict and of the Contractor's proposed course of action for resolution by the Contracting Officer.

The Contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, to the extent that such compliance is not inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

The Contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all requisite licenses and permits.

The Contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer of compliance with this clause.

(7) Construction Personnel

The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The Contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing, that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

After receipt of the Notice of Award, the Contractor has ten (10) calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer the following requirements for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks: (1) list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project, and (2) completed Authority for Release Information of each personnel. The Contractor shall use the form provided under Section I, Attachment 6.

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or resubmittal of the application.

Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This badge may be revoked at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

The Contractor shall provide an English speaking supervisor on site at all times. This position is considered as key personnel under this purchase order.

(8) Materials and Equipment

All materials and equipment incorporated into the work shall be new and for the purpose intended, unless otherwise specified. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner that will withstand inspection by the Contracting Officer.

(9) Special Warranties

Any special warranties that may be required under the contract shall be subject to the stipulations set forth in 52.246-21, "Warranty of Construction", as long as they are not in conflict.

The Contractor shall obtain and furnish to the Government all information required to make any subcontractor's, manufacturer's, or supplier's guarantee or warranty legally binding and effective. The Contractor shall submit both the information and the guarantee or warranty to the Government in sufficient time to permit the Government to meet any time limit specified in the guarantee or warranty, but not later than completion and acceptance of all work under this contract.

(10) Equitable Adjustments

- (a) the date, circumstances, and applicable contract clause authorizing an equitable adjustment and
- (b) that the Contractor regards the event as a changed condition for which an equitable adjustment is allowed under the contract.

The Contractor shall provide written notice of a differing site condition within 10 calendar days of occurrence following FAR 52.236-2, Differing Site Conditions.

(11) Zoning Approvals and Permits

The Contractor shall be responsible for:

- obtaining proper zoning or other land use control approval for the project
- obtaining the approval of the Contracting Drawings and Specifications
- paying fees due for the foregoing; and,
- for obtaining and paying for the initial building permits.

**1.0 INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 The U.S. Embassy in Ottawa has a requirement to obtain Construction Services for replacing the Plaza Roof Drain that is located near the Chancery's South Emergency Exit Door. Unit is to be replaced with a new complete assembly of the same make and model. If same make and model no longer available, replacement drain assembly to be of similar size and performance and be acceptable to COR.
- 1.2 The Contractor shall provide construction personnel as needed to complete the services that meet the technical requirements in this Statement of Work [SOW].
- 1.3 It is expected that the Contractor shall partner closely with Contracting Officer Representative (COR).

**2.0 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

- 2.1 The Contractor shall provide the facilities support to provide a site survey, material procurement and construction, to complete this project.
- 2.2 The work shall be executed in a diligent manner in accordance with a negotiated firm fixed price and performance period. The period of performance for project completion shall be 10 calendar days from the start date indicated in the Notice to Proceed (NTP). Work shall be performed during a consecutive five day period (M-F) as determined by the COR.

**3.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION**

- 3.1 The Contractor shall not conduct any work that is beyond this Statement of Work unless directed in writing by the Contracting Officer [CO]. Any work done by the Contractor beyond this SOW without direction from the CO will be at the Contractor's own risk and at no cost to the USG.
- 3.2 The Contracting Officer shall provide a Notice to Proceed [NTP] to the Contractor. No work shall be initiated until the NTP is issued by the CO.
- 3.3 The Contracting Officer may designate one individual to serve as the Contracting Officer's Representative [COR]. The Contractor will be furnished evidence of COR appointment, including explicit authority delegated to the COR and their responsibilities.
- 3.4 The USG does not make representations or warranties of whatsoever kind or nature, either expressed or implied, as to the quality, level of completion, accuracy, extent of compliance with the standards, codes and requirements described or referred to in this SOW, or the extent of coordination between or among the documents provided to the Contractor.

- 3.5 The USG review, approval, or acceptance of, nor payment for the services required under this contract shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this contract or any cause of action against the Contractor arising out of the performance of this contract.
- 3.6 The USG has the right to inspect and test all services called for by the contract, to the extent practicable at all times and places during the term of the contract. The USG may perform quality assurance inspections [QAI] and tests during construction to confirm the work is installed according to the Construction Documents.
- 3.7 The Contracting Officer has the authority to issue a temporary stop order during the execution of any particular phase of this SOW. This authority may be executed when the Consulate requires time for official functions, or is in possession of specific credible information indicating that the lives of Consulate personnel are immediately threatened and that the execution of the project will increase the Consulate's vulnerability. The Contractor shall promptly notify the CO that work has been stopped.
- 3.9 If any of the Contractor's services do not conform to the contract requirements, the COR may require the Contractor to perform the services again in conformity with the contract requirements. The USG may by contract or otherwise, perform the services and charge the Contractor any cost incurred by the USG that is directly related to the performance of such service or terminate the contract for default.
- 3.10 The USG has the right to terminate this contract of convenience at any time in whole, or from time to time, if the Contracting Officer determines it is in the interest of the USG.

#### **4.0 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR**

- 4.1 The Contractor shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, and the coordination of all construction and other services furnished under this contract. The Contractor shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its construction and other services.
- 4.2 The Contractor shall identify a Project Site Manager who shall be responsible for the overall management of the project and shall represent the Contractor on the site during construction. The Project Site Manager shall be approved by the COR.
- 4.3 All documentation produced for this project will become the ownership of the USG at the completion of this project.
- 4.4 The Contractor shall verify that all materials, equipment, and systems provide operational dependability. The Contractor shall assure that the project is constructed to be easily maintained or replaced with readily available materials and services. Emphasis shall be placed on the compatibility of materials to maximize uniformity.
- 4.5 Any cost associated with services subcontracted by the Contractor shall be borne by and be the complete responsibility of the Contractor under the fixed price of this contract.
- 4.6 The Contractor is responsible for safety and shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety and similar matters. The Contractor shall promptly report all accidents resulting in lost time, disabling, or fatal injuries to the COR.

4.7 Rights and remedies for the USG provided for under this contract are in addition to any other rights and remedies The Contractor shall be and remain liable to the USG in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the Embassy caused by the Contractor's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this contract. The provided by law.

## **5.0 PRE-CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS**

5.1 The Contractor shall examine all the documents and visit the construction site to fully inform themselves of all the conditions and limitations applied to the work and submit a firm fixed price cost proposal for all the work. No subsequent allowance will be made to the Contractor for neglect of the existing conditions.

5.2 The Contractor shall prepare and submit a Project Safety Plan [PSP].

5.3 Develop and submit a Bill of Materials [BOM] and product data of all materials to be used in the project. The BOM's shall list the equipment and materials in sufficient detail that a purchase order for the materials and equipment can be executed without further elaboration or specifications. This document will be used by the USG to approve all equipment and materials.

## **6.0 CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS**

6.1 No construction shall begin until approvals of the Pre-Construction Submittals are accepted by the COR.

6.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for all required materials, equipment and personnel to manage, administer, and supervise the flooring replacement project. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner as determined by the COR.

6.3 All materials and equipment incorporated into the project shall be new unless noted otherwise. The Contractor shall transport and safeguard all materials and equipment required for construction.

## **7.0 SPECIFICATIONS**

The contractor will be responsible to properly install, and seal the new drain assembly using the original method of installation and manufacturer's installation instructions.

The contractor shall provide and install temporary protection over any openings which if not sealed could result in leaks.

All handling/repairs of roof membrane to be performed by a professional roofer.

The drain assembly is to be leaked tested (flooding method) in the presence of the contracting officer or his representative before the backfilling can take place.

Holes in the sides of drains should be at the same elevation as top of the waterproof membrane to allow to escape. Wrap drains in geotextile to prevent loss of bedding material through drain holes. Drain assembly to be sealed to roof deck with waterproof gasket.

The contractor will be responsible to remove/restore a section of the plaza to access the drain. The pavers will be set using following method:

1 – Backfill 6” around new drain with ¾” **clean crush stone** wrap in geotextile (backfill has to be compacted every 3”).

2 – Backfill the remainder with compacted 0-3/4” **crush stone** (backfill has to be compacted every 3”) leaving enough room at the top for the pavers and the screeding.

3 - Pavers are laid on a bed of coarse sand or fine screenings. This bed should be 1" to 1-1/2" thick, no more, and is placed directly on the compacted granular base.

4 - Level the sand or screenings evenly by pulling a straight board along the guides. You can check the final level of the pavers by placing a paver on a guide. Remember to maintain drainage slope (1/4" per foot) towards the drain.

5 - Lay the original pavers directly on the screeded bed, leaving a small space, approximately 1/8" (3mm) between each paver. If a different sized drain is used, some pavers will need to be saw cut for a proper fit.

6 - After the installation is complete, the pavers must be swept clean and then compacted with a plate compactor. This helps settle the pavers into the bedding course and creates a smooth flat finish. Pavers have to be flush with the drain when compacted.

7 - Sweeping specially graded jointing sand with bounding agent into the joints of the pavers further locks the pavers together. Using a compactor will assist the joining sand to penetrate in the joints. It is important to keep the joints filled to the top.

8 – Clean area and dispose of any leftover material.

9 - See attached drawing for pavers installation details

10 – All material, tools, labor, etc. are to be contractor furnished and installed.

## **8.0 DELIVERABLE SCHEDULE**

8.1 The Contractor shall commence work under this contract promptly, execute the work diligently, and achieve final completion and acceptance of the plaza deck replacement project including final cleanup of the premises within the contract period specified.

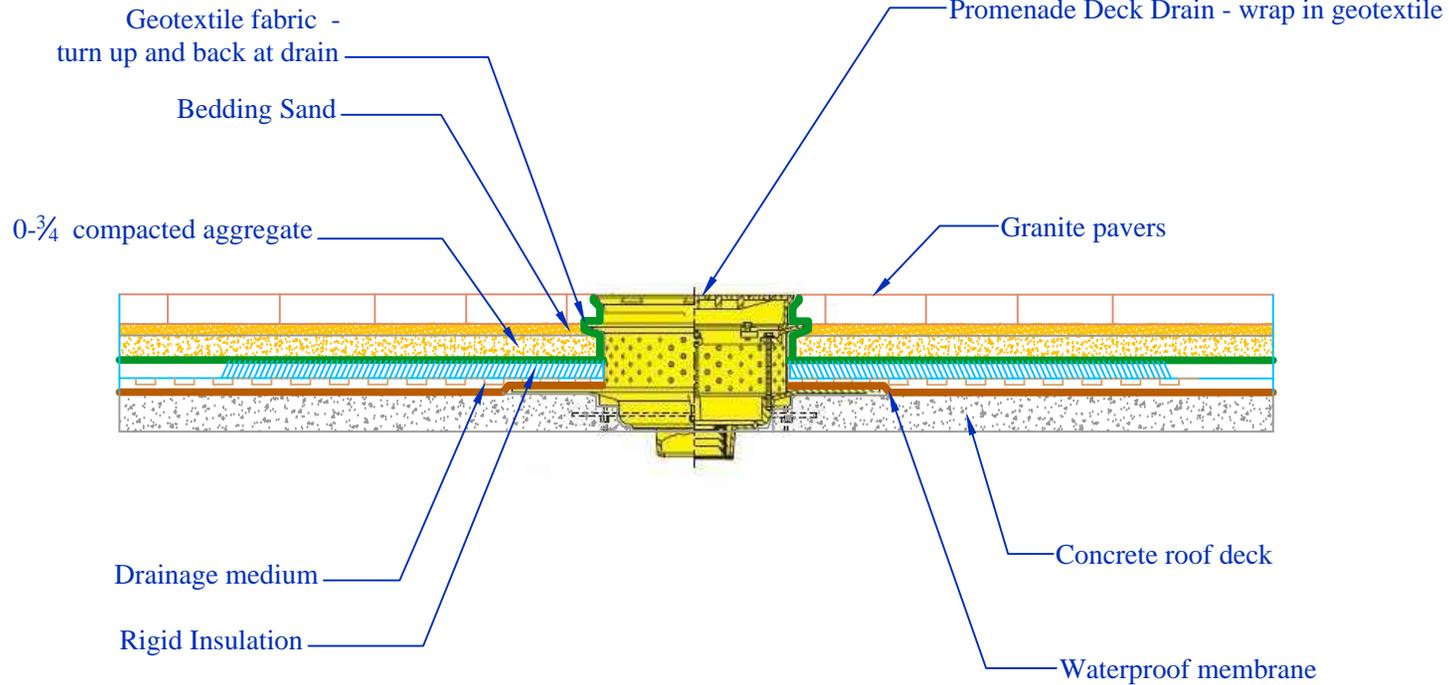

The Contractor shall be responsible for the proper performance of the Work only to the extent that the design and specifications permit such performance.

Subject to the above, the Contractor agrees to correct promptly at his own expense, defects or deficiencies in the Work which appear prior to and during the period of one (1) year from the date of Substantial Performance of Work, or within such longer period of time as may be specified for certain Products or Work, except that the warranty period for any Work identified by the Owner as not having been substantially completed at the date of Substantial Performance of Work will commence on the date all work is actually completed to acceptance of Owner. In making the repairs or correcting the deficiencies, the contractor shall coordinate such activities as to cause minimum disruption to the activities of the Owner. In addition to the obligation to repair and correct defects and deficiencies as aforesaid, the contractor shall be responsible for all direct costs incurred by the Owner related to or arising from the correction of repair activity undertaken by the Contractor. The provisions of any special warranties set forth in the specifications are in addition to and not in substitution of this warranty. Where manufacturers offer, as a general policy, extended warranties on their Products greater than those called for in the specifications the Contractor shall submit certification of such extensions or benefits before the final claim for payment to the same.

The Contractor agrees to pay for damage resulting from corrections made under the requirements of the clause above.

During the warranty period, the Owner shall promptly give the Contractor written notice of observed defects and deficiencies.

The Contractor shall also enforce the warranty obligations of his subcontractors, manufacturers and suppliers.

The Contractor shall correct at its own expense subsequent defects in the corrected Work appearing within a period of one (1) year from the date of acceptance of the corrected Work by the Owner, or within such longer period as specified for certain Products or Work, and the entire warranty period as aforesaid in respect of such corrected Work shall commence again.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the above paragraph, neither test results, nor selection or approval by the Owner or the Consultant of testing entities, nor anything in this Article shall have the effect of limiting or shortening or otherwise affecting in any way whatsoever the duration, effectiveness or content of any guarantee or warranty set forth in any other document or material forming part of the Contract documents.

Without otherwise limiting or affecting the obligations of the Contractor in law in respect of latent defects generally, if any latent defect is found during the first two (2) years operation of the Project by the Owner, the Contractor shall at its own expense, correct the defect and extend the warranty period for the corrected Work by one (1) year, or for such longer period as may be specified for certain Products or work in the Contract documents. Similarly, if any latent defect is found in the corrected Work during the period covered by such extended warranty, the contractor shall at its own expense correct the defect and the extended warranty period shall be commenced again for one (1) year from the date of acceptance of the corrected work by the Owner, or for such longer period as may be specified for certain Products or Work.

### Extended Warranties and Guarantees

Warranties and Guarantees of duration longer than one year after the date of substantial performance are hereby assigned to the Owner.
