The U.S. Embassy in OTTAWA is seeking an individual for employment in CANADA for the position of General Engineer in the Facility Management Office.

BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION

Incumbent serves as the Mission General Engineer, Planner Estimator and Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) and or Contracting Officer Representative (COR) for U.S. Mission Canada maintenance, repair, construction and renovation projects for both residential and non-residential Government Owned properties in Canada. Prepares designs, statement of work and drawings for repair, renovations, reconfigurations and alteration projects and participate in the technical evaluation process. Manages and updates Mission architectural and engineering archive of documents and drawings in conjunction with alterations and new construction using AutoCAD, performs site visits to obtain measurements, as-built and other necessary data. Prepares designs, statement of work and drawings for renovations, reconfigurations and alteration projects and participates in the procurement

technical evaluation process. Performs routine Quality Control (QC) inspections and confirms contractor compliance with specifications, safety and other contracted project work and requirements. Must be available and able to travel for USG within Canada up to 4 weeks per year.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

NOTE: Applicants must address each required qualification listed below with specific and comprehensive information supporting each item. Failure to do so may result in a determination that the applicant is not qualified.

- 1. Education:** University Bachelor's degree in Architectural, Mechanical, Electrical or Civil Engineering.
- 2. Experience:** Minimum three years of progressively responsible experience in the building construction and or facility management and additional two years' experience in project planning and estimation. Two years of this experience must include general project supervision and inspection.
- 3. Language:** Level IV (Fluent) speaking/reading/writing English.
- 4. Knowledge:** Must have good knowledge of Architectural, Civil, Electrical and Mechanical engineering theories, inspection practices and procedures, of construction practices and techniques, and work of the principal construction trades. Must be able to identify and evaluate conformance to specifications, safety, adequacy, and quality of work. Possess good working knowledge of local, provincial, and International Building Codes (IBC), standard engineering reference works and handbooks, AIA handbooks and requirements on construction work. Must have a full knowledge of safety practices applicable to the construction industry and local safety laws for Canada and Mission SHEM program, and common safety protocols.
- 5. Skills and Abilities:** Personal skills: Must possess professional and technical ability able to program, plan, schedule, evaluate, organize and delegate effectively. Must possess excellent organization and time management skills. Must be able to work independently with minimum supervision, work under stress to trouble shoot and solve site problems, and be willing to work outside normal working hours occasionally. Must be willing to work outdoors and perform field work in addition to office based functions.

Technical skills: Must be able to exercise a high degree of initiative and judgment in scoping work activities, evaluating quality of work performed and selection of appropriate materials and finishes. Must have proven construction and renovation skills in architectural and engineering work and demonstrate the ability to learn, understand and acquire technical knowledge in other disciplines.

Computer skills: Must have effective computer skills of AutoCad 2014 or newer , Microsoft Office Suite, MS Project, and the ability to use various internet search engines are required. Able to type at 35 words/minute.

Safety: Must be able to perform all job activities and duties in a responsible manner to avoid the creation of safety or health hazards and conform to established safety and health policies. Must be able to utilize, and enforce appropriate usage of, personal protective equipment (PPE) as required by the

job activity. Required to report any unsafe and or hazardous conditions immediately to Post POSHO.

6. Interpersonal Skills: Must possess good judgment, excellent interpersonal skills to communicate and work with customers and employees of all levels.

SELECTION PROCESS

When qualified, applicants who are U.S. Citizen Eligible Family Members (USEFMs) and/or preference-eligible U.S. Veterans are given a preference in hiring. Therefore, it is essential that these applicants make themselves known as having a hiring preference and specifically address the required qualifications above in their application.

HIRING PREFERENCE ORDER:

- (1) USEFM who is ALSO a preference-eligible U.S. Veteran
- (2) USEFM OR a preference-eligible U.S. Veteran
- (3) FS on LWOP

ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Management may consider the following when determining successful candidacy: nepotism, conflicts of interest, budget, and residency status.
2. Current OR employees serving a probationary period are not eligible to apply. Current OR employees with an Overall Summary Rating of Needs Improvement or Unsatisfactory on their most recent Employee Performance Report (EPR) are not eligible to apply.
3. Current NOR employees hired on a Family Member Appointment (FMA) or a Personal Service Agreement (PSA) are not eligible to apply within the first 90 calendar days of their employment, unless they have a When Actually Employed (WAE) work schedule.
4. The candidate must be able to obtain and hold a Non- Sensitive security clearance.

TO APPLY

Applicants must submit the following documents to be considered:

1. A cover letter addressing each of the six required qualifications detailed in the job announcement by identifying them and addressing how the applicant meets each of the qualifications.
2. Universal Application for Employment (UAE) (Form DS-174), which is available on our website at <http://canada.usembassy.gov/about-us/human-resources.html> or by contacting Human Resources. (See "For Further Information" above); and
3. Any additional documentation that supports or addresses the requirements listed above (e.g. transcripts, degrees, etc.).
4. Proof of eligibility to work in Canada (e.g., copy of passport, birth certificate, permanent residency card, etc.).

IMPORTANT: Applicants claiming a U.S. Veteran's preference must submit written documentation confirming eligibility (e.g., Member Copy 4 of Form DD-214, Letter from the Veteran's Administration, or certification documenting eligibility under the VOW Act with an expected discharge no later than 120 days after the certification is submitted) by the closing date of the vacancy announcement. If the written documentation confirming eligibility is not received in the HR office by the closing date of the vacancy announcement, the U.S. Veteran's preference will not be considered in the application process. Specific criteria for receiving a U.S. Veteran's preference may be found in HR/OE's Family Member Employment Policy (FMEP).

DEFINITIONS

Appendix A.

Eligible Family Member (EFM): An EFM for employment purposes is defined an individual who meets all of the following criteria:

- U.S. Citizen or not a U.S. Citizen; and
- Spouse or same-sex domestic partner (as defined in 3 FAM 1610); or
- Child, who is unmarried and under 21 years of age or, regardless of age, is incapable of self-support. The term "child" shall include, in addition to natural offspring, stepchild, adopted child, and a child under legal guardianship of employee, spouse, or same-sex domestic partner when such child is expected to be under legal guardianship until 21 years of age and when dependent upon and normally residing with the guardian; or
- Parent (including stepparents and legally adoptive parents) of employee, spouse, or same-sex domestic partner, when such parent is at least 51 percent dependent on the employee for support; or
- Sister or brother (including stepsisters and stepbrothers, or adoptive sisters or brothers) of the employee, spouse, or same-sex domestic partner when such sibling is at least 51 percent dependent on the employee for support, unmarried, and under 21 years of age, or regardless of age, incapable of self-support; and
- Listed on the travel orders or approved Form OF-126 of a sponsoring employee, i.e., a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member who is permanently assigned to or stationed abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and
- Is under chief of mission authority.

U.S. Citizen Eligible Family Member (USEFM): A USEFM is an individual who meets all of the following criteria:

- U.S. Citizen; and
- Spouse or same-sex domestic partner (as defined in 3 FAM 1610) of the sponsoring employee; or

- Child of the sponsoring employee who is unmarried and at least 18 years old; and
- Listed on the travel orders or approved Form OF-126 of a sponsoring employee, i.e., a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member who is permanently assigned to or stationed abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and resides at the sponsoring employee's post of assignment abroad, or as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and is under chief of mission authority; or
- resides at an Involuntary Separate Maintenance Allowance (ISMA) location authorized under 3 FAM 3232.2; or
- Currently receives a U.S. Government retirement annuity or pension from a career in the U.S. Foreign Service or Civil Service.

Appointment Eligible Family Member (AEFM): An AEFM is an individual who meets all of the following criteria:

- U.S. Citizen; and
- Spouse or same-sex domestic partner (as defined in 3 FAM 1610) of the sponsoring employee; or
- Child of the sponsoring employee who is unmarried and at least 18 years old; and
- Listed on the travel orders or approved Form OF-126 of a sponsoring employee, i.e., a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member who is permanently assigned to or stationed abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT); and
- Is under chief of mission authority; and
- Is residing at the sponsoring employee's post of assignment abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and
- Does NOT currently receive a U.S. Government retirement annuity or pension from a career in the U.S. Foreign Service or Civil Service.

Member of Household (MOH): A MOH is an individual who meets all of the following criteria.

- A MOH is someone who accompanies or joins a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member permanently assigned to or stationed abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and
- A MOH must be officially declared to the COM by the sponsoring employee as part of his/her household; and
- A MOH is under COM authority;
- A MOH may include a parent, unmarried partner, other relative, or adult child;
- A MOH may or may not be a U.S. Citizen;
- A MOH is not an EFM;
- A MOH is not listed on the travel orders or approved Form F-126 of a sponsoring employee.

Not Ordinarily Resident (NOR) - An individual who meets the following criteria:

- An EFM, USEFM or AEFM of a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member permanently assigned or stationed abroad, or as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; or
- Has diplomatic privileges and immunities; and

- Is eligible for compensation under the FS or GS salary schedule; and
- Has a U.S. Social Security Number (SSN); and
- Is not a citizen of the host country; and
- Does not ordinarily reside in the host country; and
- Is not subject to host country employment and tax laws.

Ordinarily Resident (OR) - An individual who meets the following criteria:

- A citizen of the host country; or
- A non-citizen of the host country (including a U.S. citizen or a third-country national) who is locally resident and has legal and/or permanent resident status within the host country and/or who is a holder of a non-diplomatic visa/work and/or residency permit; and/or
- Is subject to host country employment and tax laws.
