

U.S.-China Fulbright Program Accompanying Dependant Policy Statement for Student Programs

The U.S. Embassy-Beijing and China's Ministry of Education have determined that the U.S.-China Fulbright Program will not provide support for the accompanying dependents of student grantees. This applies to both U.S. Fulbright Student Programs and to the relevant components of the Fulbright Foreign Student Program (including the Chinese Foreign Language Teaching Assistants Program, Chinese Master's Degree Program and the Chinese Ph.D. Dissertation Research Program).

In keeping with this policy, no administrative or financial support will be provided by the U.S-China Fulbright Program for J-2 dependent visas for Chinese student grantees, nor will the Program provide comparable financial or administrative support for American student grantees. Chinese or U.S. Student Program grantees who wish to be accompanied or visited by their dependents during their grant term will need to make the necessary visa and logistic arrangements on their own, in line with the laws and regulations of the destination country. Neither IIE nor the US Embassy will be able to assist in this process or issue any relevant paperwork.
