

Q&A- PR4470280 - Inter (Y-9) - Medical Combat Training and Certification

1. The SOW specifies 2 courses (Basic & Advanced) will be conducted in 3 different locations and gives total student numbers for each class. Could DoS advise how many students and which classes should be trained at each location? – Each Basic and Advance class should be trained in 2 cycles at each location, that way these Police Bases have Combat medics available at all times. Please see table below with number of students from each CNP Base.

2. The SOW states the training will be conducted in 2 cycles. Is it possible to divide the classes into smaller groups? – We’d consider this option as long as the suggested schedule doesn’t exceed the maximum period of time detailed in the SOW, and each class has a reasonable number of students; this in order to finalize complete the certification sooner.
3. Is the contractor expected to conduct training and multiple locations simultaneously? Or can one training team be utilized moving from location to location? – The ideal is to have all three Jungla Companies trained during the same time. However, we will consider having one training team move from location to location as long as all training is completed within the time period detailed in the SOW. Please note that all expenses originated by moving the teams and shipping training material should be covered by the contracted vendor.
4. Is the 5 to 1 instructor to student ratio required to be maintained throughout the entire course or practical sessions only? – We can accept a minimum of 10 to 1 instructor ratio for class room classes. However, 1 (one) instructor is required per every 5 students during practical sessions.
5. Are any scheduling restraints expected in regards to the CNP making the students available for training? – No, the CNP has made a commitment to have this personnel available during all scheduled classes; hence the importance of receiving the suggested program within a reasonable time.
6. Is it acceptable to provide training certifications recognized by US organizations such as NAEMT and AHA instead of Colombian certifications? If not, can DoS provide a point of contact to apply for accreditation in Colombia? – No, this personnel is required to attend emergencies within the Colombian territory, and a national certification is a MUST, as well as NAEMT and AHA certifications, which are

required for training conducted overseas. Also, DoS does not have a point of contact to apply for accreditation in Colombia. It should also be noted that both trainings should be conducted in SPANISH
