## CLAUSES INCORPORATED BY FULL TEXT

**52.212-2 EVALUATION--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (JAN 1999)**

(a) The Government will award a contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible offeror whose offer conforming to the solicitation will be most advantageous to the Government, price and other factors considered. The following factors shall be used to evaluate offers:

1. Technical Acceptability - Offers will be rated on an "Acceptable", or "Unacceptable" basis. Technical acceptability will be determined by the quoted items meeting or exceeding all the specifications/requirements in the Performance Work Statement. If one of the specifications is not met, the offer shall be considered technically unacceptable and shall not be considered for award. Offeror shall submit a certification stating that the contractor has the capability and facilities to provide all the requirements stated in the solicitation. Offeror shall be included in the US-Embassy Bogota Regional Security Office approved hotel list. If the offeror is not included in this list, it will not be considered for award.

2. Price - Price will not be assigned an adjectival rating; however, proposed prices evaluated as unreasonably high may be grounds for eliminating an offer from the competitive range. Price will be evaluated to determine if the offeror's proposed price is fair, reasonable, and balanced utilizing price analysis techniques in accordance with the guidelines in FAR 15.404-1(b). The Government will award contracts to offerors whose technically acceptable proposal represents the lowest price to the Government. Unless otherwise specified, offerors shall submit prices for all CLINs. Failure to submit a price for any CLIN/sub-CLIN shall result in the offer being considered unacceptable

Award will be made to the lowest priced technically acceptable proposal

(b) A written notice of award or acceptance of an offer, mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful offeror within the time for acceptance specified in the offer, shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party. Before the offer's specified expiration time, the Government may accept an offer (or part of an offer), whether or not there are negotiations after its receipt, unless a written notice of withdrawal is received before award.

(End of provision)

### **52.212-3 OFFEROR REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (NOV 2013)**

An offeror shall complete only paragraph (b) of this provision if the offeror has completed the annual representations and certifications electronically via <http://www.acquisition.gov>. If an offeror has not completed the annual representations and certifications electronically at the System for Award Management (SAM) website, the offeror shall complete only paragraphs (c) through (o) of this provision.

(a) Definitions. As used in this provision --

"Economically disadvantaged women-owned small business (EDWOSB) Concern" means a small business concern that is at least 51 percent directly and unconditionally owned by, and the management and daily business operations of which are controlled by, one or more women who are citizens of the United States and who are economically disadvantaged in accordance with 13 CFR part 127. It automatically qualifies as a women-owned small business eligible under the WOSB Program.

"Forced or indentured child labor" means all work or service-

(1) Exacted from any person under the age of 18 under the menace of any penalty for its nonperformance and for which the worker does not offer himself voluntarily; or

(2) Performed by any person under the age of 18 pursuant to a contract the enforcement of which can be accomplished by process or penalties.

Inverted domestic corporation, as used in this section, means a foreign incorporated entity which is treated as an inverted domestic corporation under 6 U.S.C. 395(b), i.e., a corporation that used to be incorporated in the United States, or used to be a partnership in the United States, but now is incorporated in a foreign country, or is a subsidiary whose parent corporation is incorporated in a foreign country, that meets the criteria specified in 6 U.S.C.

395(b), applied in accordance with the rules and definitions of 6 U.S.C. 395(c). An inverted domestic corporation as herein defined does not meet the definition of an inverted domestic corporation as defined by the Internal Revenue Code at 26 U.S.C. 7874.

Manufactured end product means any end product in Federal Supply Classes (FSC) 1000-9999, except--

- (1) FSC 5510, Lumber and Related Basic Wood Materials;
- (2) Federal Supply Group (FSG) 87, Agricultural Supplies;
- (3) FSG 88, Live Animals;
- (4) FSG 89, Food and Related Consumables;
- (5) FSC 9410, Crude Grades of Plant Materials;
- (6) FSC 9430, Miscellaneous Crude Animal Products, Inedible;
- (7) FSC 9440, Miscellaneous Crude Agricultural and Forestry Products;
- (8) FSC 9610, Ores;
- (9) FSC 9620, Minerals, Natural and Synthetic; and
- (10) FSC 9630, Additive Metal Materials.

Place of manufacture means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

Restricted business operations means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate--

- (1) Are conducted under contract directly and exclusively with the regional government of southern Sudan;
- (2) Are conducted pursuant to specific authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control in the Department of the Treasury, or are expressly exempted under Federal law from the requirement to be conducted under such authorization;
- (3) Consist of providing goods or services to marginalized populations of Sudan;
- (4) Consist of providing goods or services to an internationally recognized peacekeeping force or humanitarian organization;
- (5) Consist of providing goods or services that are used only to promote health or education; or
- (6) Have been voluntarily suspended.

Sensitive technology--

(1) Means hardware, software, telecommunications equipment, or any other technology that is to be used specifically--

(i) To restrict the free flow of unbiased information in Iran; or

(ii) To disrupt, monitor, or otherwise restrict speech of the people of Iran; and

(2) Does not include information or informational materials the export of which the President does not have the authority to regulate or prohibit pursuant to section 203(b)(3) of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1702(b)(3)).

Service-disabled veteran-owned small business concern--

(1) Means a small business concern--

(i) Not less than 51 percent of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans; and

(ii) The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of a service-disabled veteran with permanent and severe disability, the spouse or permanent caregiver of such veteran.

(2) Service-disabled veteran means a veteran, as defined in 38 U.S.C. 101(2), with a disability that is service-connected, as defined in 38 U.S.C. 101(16).

"Small business concern" means a concern, including its affiliates, that is independently owned and operated, not dominant in the field of operation in which it is bidding on Government contracts, and qualified as a small business under the criteria in 13 CFR Part 121 and size standards in this solicitation.

Subsidiary means an entity in which more than 50 percent of the entity is owned--

(1) Directly by a parent corporation; or

(2) Through another subsidiary of a parent corporation.

Veteran-owned small business concern means a small business concern--

(1) Not less than 51 percent of which is owned by one or more veterans (as defined at 38 U.S.C. 101(2)) or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more veterans; and

(2) The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more veterans.

"Women-owned business concern" means a concern which is at least 51 percent owned by one or more women; or in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more women; and whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

"Women-owned small business concern" means a small business concern--

(1) That is at least 51 percent owned by one or more women or, in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of its stock is owned by one or more women; or

(2) Whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

Women-owned small business (WOSB) concern eligible under the WOSB Program (in accordance with 13 CFR part 127)”, means a small business concern that is at least 51 percent directly and unconditionally owned by, and the management and daily business operations of which are controlled by, one or more women who are citizens of the United States.

## PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT

**1.0 INTRODUCTION:** This is a non-personal service for lodging, meals, conference facilities, and other services to be provided to Special Operations Command South (SOC SO), also referred to herein as “the Government”) in support of the US ARMY SOCSOUTH FUERZAS COMANDO 2014. Attendees will generally arrive a few days before the exercise starts, participate, and depart the day after the conclusion.

## **2.0 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

**2.1 Check-in and Checkout:** In some cases, participants may show up earlier than regular check-in time. Contractor shall allow early arrivals to check-in early if there is availability of rooms. The hotel shall additionally allow guests with late flight departures to check out as late as 12 P.M. when possible. Contractor shall provide a secure area for storage of personal luggage when neither early check-in nor late check-out are possible.

**2.2** Price quotes given by hotels for services shall include any applicable local, regional, and national taxes and/or service fees.

**2.3 Quality Standards for Rooms:** All rooms shall include a high standard of hygiene, private bath with full toilet and shower facilities, hot and cold running water, clean linen on a daily basis, working electricity, color television with cable, clock, and telephone. The room shall also be appropriately furnished. When possible, all attendees will be placed on the same floor.

**2.3.1 Internet:** When possible the hotel shall provide high speed internet connection with a rate of no less than 2MB for every room under this contract, at no additional cost.

**2.4** The US Government may request additional rooms at the same quoted rate; subject to room availability.

**2.5** The US Government Representative will identify those individuals on the guest list whose rooms will be paid by the US Government, under the proposed contract. All other rooms and services shall be the responsibility of the individual (“self pay”) and the government will not be held liable. The US Government will not pay for telephone calls, mini-bar, room service, cell phones, and hotel charges other than those specifically provided for in this contract. It is highly recommended the hotel request a credit card from guests upon check-in to secure potential unauthorized charges. Charges not covered by the US Government are to be resolved between the guests and the hotel.

**2.6** The US Government will only pay for rooms and services actually used and any applicable penalties due to late cancellations, if any.

**2.7 Hotel Representative:** The hotel shall provide a representative as a liaison for the conference upon contract award. The hotel representative (HR) must be vested with the authority to resolve issues involving conference execution and payment as they arise. The HR shall be available throughout the time period the hotel is in use by the US Government. The hotel will provide a list of on-call hotel points-of-contact who have the authority to resolve issues affecting their particular areas of support, (for example: room maintenance, security, banquets, payment, etc) upon contract award.

**2.8 Service Breakdowns:** The hotel shall ensure required maintenance or repairs for hotel equipment, to include guest rooms, conference facilities, breakout rooms, elevators, kitchen equipment, etc. are corrected immediately at the expense of the hotel. All equipment shall be repaired within one hour or replaced within two hours of reported malfunction.

**2.9 Baggage Service:** The hotel shall provide baggage handling for conference hotel guests during check-in

and check-out.

**2.10 Extended Stays:** Conference guests wishing to extend their stay in the hotel must checkout within the designated checkout time on the specified end date. Guests who wish to extend their stay at the hotel may do so at their own expense and at the hotel's discretion and the guests' financial resources. The Government shall not be responsible for any additional costs the guest may incur if he/she decides to extend his/her stay beyond the dates authorized under this contract. If flights are delayed/cancelled due to inclement weather, the participants covered under the lodging contract shall be allowed to come back to the hotel and use the facilities while awaiting transportation. If the delay/cancellation is such that the NON-US participants must stay an extra night/s awaiting transportation, they will have the option of checking back in at the US Government expense. The contractor shall immediately notify the contracting officer and the Government's POC if this situation arises.

**2.12 Announcement Boards:** The hotel shall provide appropriate announcement boards at each entrance to the hotel and main conference room welcoming and directing conference participants. The government representative will provide the exact wording of the announcement to the hotel.

### 3.0 SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

**3.1 LODGING:** The Government is only responsible and will pay under contract for NON-US personnel. The contractor shall allow the US Government to block rooms for "Self Pay" personnel. The "Self Pay" personnel are individually responsible for their own bills, rooms and shall be provided at the contracted price. The US Government will only pay for rooms used by our Non-US Personnel under this contract. Anticipated lodging schedule for NON-US and Self Pay personnel are as follows:

### 3.2 MEALS

**3.2.1 General:** Scheduled meals are prepared according to predetermined menus. The US Government Representative will identify individuals with dietary restrictions. The hotel will strive to accommodate special diets where feasible and within contracted meal rates. Food served in buffet style should be labeled. One non-alcoholic juice, soft drinks, coffee, tea or beverage is included with meals. If voucher use, sign-in sheet, or any other system is used, it will be controlled/approved by the Government representative. Contractor shall ensure that names on the

voucher or sign-in sheet are legible and shall check the names against the list of NON-US personnel covered under this contract. Contractor shall not be paid for any meals consumed by an individual not in the authorized list. Contractor must be able to package any of the meals allowing individual consumers to transport and eat at their convenience when previously coordinated.

**3.2.2 Hotel Meal Program.** The hotel will account for meals served to NON-US Participants and will provide a consumption list (head count) at the end of each business day to the Government representative with an invoice showing actual charges for each meal. Hotel shall submit receipts and other billing information as requested by the Contracting Officer. **NOTE: Payment for any drink containing alcohol is the responsibility of and must be paid for separately by the guest requesting such beverage. Participants, other than the 28 participants specified in this contract, are “Self Pay” and must pay for any goods and/or services rendered.**

**3.2.3 Schedule of Contracted Meals**

**3.2.3.1 Breakfast:** **The breakfast shall be included in the room rate.** The hotel shall provide breakfast from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. at an appropriate facility on site as agreed to by the vendor and the Government.

**3.2.3.2 Lunch:** The hotel shall provide its standard buffet luncheon or menu selection at an appropriate facility on site as agreed to by the vendor and the Government. The Voucher or Sign-in system shall apply to authorized personnel. Any unauthorized charges shall be billed directly to the user. Lunch shall, as a minimum, consist of main entrees, side dishes, dessert, and a non-alcoholic beverage such as water, juice, soft drinks, tea/coffee and be consistent with a value sufficient to provide a complete luncheon meal. The US Government will only pay for lunch consumed by the Non-US Personnel under this contract. The hotel shall provide a minimum of four choices for its buffet/menu selection(s).

**3.2.3.3 Dinner:** The hotel shall provide its standard dinner buffet or menu selection at an appropriate facility on site as agreed to by the vendor and the Government. The Voucher or Sign-in system shall apply to authorized personnel. Any un-authorized charges shall be billed directly to the user. Dinner shall, as a minimum, consist of main entrees, side dishes, dessert, and a non-alcoholic beverage such as water, juice, soft drinks, tea and or coffee and be consistent with a value sufficient to provide a complete dinner meal. The hotel shall provide a minimum of four choices for its buffet/menu selection(s). The US Government will only pay for dinner consumed by the Non-US Personnel under this contract.
