CLAUSES INCORPORATED BY FULL TEXT

52.212-2 EVALUATION--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (JAN 1999)

(a) The Government will award a contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible offeror whose offer conforming to the solicitation will be most advantageous to the Government, price and other factors considered. The following factors shall be used to evaluate offers:

Lowest Price

(b) Options. The Government will evaluate offers for award purposes by adding the total price for all options to the total price for the basic requirement. The Government may determine that an offer is unacceptable if the option prices are significantly unbalanced. Evaluation of options shall not obligate the Government to exercise the option(s).

(c) A written notice of award or acceptance of an offer, mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful offeror within the time for acceptance specified in the offer, shall result in a binding contract without further action by

either party. Before the offer's specified expiration time, the Government may accept an offer (or part of an offer), whether or not there are negotiations after its receipt, unless a written notice of withdrawal is received before award.

(End of provision)

52.212-3 OFFEROR REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (MAY 2011)

An offeror shall complete only paragraph (b) of this provision if the offeror has completed the annual representations and certifications electronically at <http://orca.bpn.gov>. If an offeror has not completed the annual representations and certifications electronically at the ORCA website, the offeror shall complete only paragraphs (c) through (o) of this provision.

(a) Definitions. As used in this provision --

"Economically disadvantaged women-owned small business (EDWOSB) Concern" means a small business concern that is at least 51 percent directly and unconditionally owned by, and the management and daily business operations of which are controlled by, one or more women who are citizens of the United States and who are economically disadvantaged in accordance with 13 CFR part 127. "Forced or indentured child labor" means all work or service-

- (1) Exacted from any person under the age of 18 under the menace of any penalty for its nonperformance and for which the worker does not offer himself voluntarily; or
- (2) Performed by any person under the age of 18 pursuant to a contract the enforcement of which can be accomplished by process or penalties.

Inverted domestic corporation, as used in this section, means a foreign incorporated entity which is treated as an inverted domestic corporation under 6 U.S.C. 395(b), i.e., a corporation that used to be incorporated in the United States, or used to be a partnership in the United States, but now is incorporated in a foreign country, or is a subsidiary whose parent corporation is incorporated in a foreign country, that meets the criteria specified in 6 U.S.C. 395(b), applied in accordance with the rules and definitions of 6 U.S.C. 395(c). An inverted domestic corporation as herein defined does not meet the definition of an inverted domestic corporation as defined by the Internal Revenue Code at 26 U.S.C. 7874.

Manufactured end product means any end product in Federal Supply Classes (FSC) 1000-9999, except--

- (1) FSC 5510, Lumber and Related Basic Wood Materials;
- (2) Federal Supply Group (FSG) 87, Agricultural Supplies;
- (3) FSG 88, Live Animals;
- (4) FSG 89, Food and Related Consumables;
- (5) FSC 9410, Crude Grades of Plant Materials;
- (6) FSC 9430, Miscellaneous Crude Animal Products, Inedible;
- (7) FSC 9440, Miscellaneous Crude Agricultural and Forestry Products;

(8) FSC 9610, Ores;

(9) FSC 9620, Minerals, Natural and Synthetic; and

(10) FSC 9630, Additive Metal Materials.

Place of manufacture means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

Restricted business operations means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate--

- (1) Are conducted under contract directly and exclusively with the regional government of southern Sudan;
- (2) Are conducted pursuant to specific authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control in the Department of the Treasury, or are expressly exempted under Federal law from the requirement to be conducted under such authorization;
- (3) Consist of providing goods or services to marginalized populations of Sudan;
- (4) Consist of providing goods or services to an internationally recognized peacekeeping force or humanitarian organization;
- (5) Consist of providing goods or services that are used only to promote health or education; or
- (6) Have been voluntarily suspended.

Service-disabled veteran-owned small business concern--

(1) Means a small business concern--

(i) Not less than 51 percent of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans; and

(ii) The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of a service-disabled veteran with permanent and severe disability, the spouse or permanent caregiver of such veteran.

(1) That is at least 51 percent owned by one or more women or, in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of its stock is owned by one or more women; or

(2) Whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

Women-owned small business (WOSB) concern eligible under the WOSB Program (in accordance with 13 CFR part 127)", means a small business concern that is at least 51 percent directly and unconditionally owned by, and the management and daily business operations of which are controlled by, one or more women who are citizens of the United States.

Performance Work Statement

Comprehensive Insurance of Liability

1.0 DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES: The contractor shall provide automobile liability insurance for The U.S. Military Group for 87 Light Armor Vehicles (LAVs) in the following breakdown: **Third party insurance for 87 LAVs, Comprehensive and Collision insurance for 1 LAV.**

2.0 PERIOD AND PLACE OF PERFORMANCE (POP): Third Party renewable yearly on August 24th. Comprehensive and Collision insurance renewable once a year.

3.0 PURPOSE: The Military Group requires that all Light Armor Vehicles (LAV) have adequate automobile liability insurance for the vehicles (LAVs) registered in the country.

4.0 SPECIFICATION: There are two insurance policies required by the Colombian government in order to operate a GOV in this country. They are Seguro Obligatorio de Accidentes de Transito (SOAT) and third party liability insurance. The latter policy has two parts: third party liability and extended coverage. The total coverage provided by the third party liability and extended coverage policy is about US \$285,000. Comprehensive and collision insurance is not required.

5.0 DESCRIPTION The amount of coverage required is adjusted each year depends upon the type of event. The maximum coverage is about US \$83, 000. This amount is the maximum total amount that could be paid to each individual in an accident. Additional coverage in not available.

6.0 REQUIREMENTS:

6.0.1 Third Party Liability

Third party liability insurance covers damages that you cause to someone else when you are at fault in a vehicle accident, up to the amount established in the policy. It does not pay for damages to you or your vehicle. Third party liability insurance covers two things: bodily injury and property damage. Bodily injury expenses include medicals bills (when the SOAT has been depleted), rehabilitation expenses and lost wages. Property damage expenses include the cost to repair or replace items that belong to another party that you damaged or destroyed. You are required to have this coverage in order to obtain the excess liability coverage. Excess liability insurance is an extension of the third party liability policy required to bring the total liability coverage to CP 660.000.000 (the mandatory amount for all diplomatic personnel). U.S. personnel may wish to consider carrying additional liability coverage from either their local insurer or a U.S. insurance company.

6.0.2 Comprehensive and Collision

Collision insurance will pay for the repairs to your vehicles regardless of who is at fault. If the other party in an accident is at fault, their third party liability insurance will pay for repairs to your car. However, if they are uninsured, your collision coverage will pay. Colombian citizens are not required to carry third party liability insurance and most do not.

Comprehensive insurance covers damage to your automobile that was not the result of an accident. Examples of this are fire, theft, and vandalism.

Comprehensive and collision insurance is usually quite expensive. Before choosing this coverage, assess the value of your car to make sure it is worth the amount you will be paying in premiums. The insurance company will usually only pay you up to the actual cash value of your car, not the amount that you will

need to replace the vehicle. In almost all cases, premiums for comprehensive and collision insurance are less expensive with a U.S. company. Further, you would receive U.S. dollars for any settlement, which might make it easier for you to repair or replace your vehicle.
