These characteristics shall be used by the Government to determine that the offered products are equal to the specified product. The brand name or equal criteria only applies to the tools/equipment.

Two (2) skylights located on the roof of the van in the center front and the rear center of each 50 x 50 cm polycarbonate 4 millimeters lime

One (1) internal crane system. This crane shall be installed inside the truck workshop, crossing the roof of the truck workshop as-shown in the attached picture. The internal crane shall include a hand chain hoist. All the internal crane system shall have maximum capacity of Six Hundred Fifty (650) kilograms.

Rear access ladder 1.30 meters long by 70 centimeters wide

The interior truck workshop structure shall be manufactured with steel sheet rolled 18 gauge galvanized.

The contractor shall provide, install and connect (to the power generator), into the truck workshop, nine (9) double electrical outlets 110 volt, two (2) outlets 220volts and three (3) outlets tri – phases; one of these tri – phase outlets shall be internal and the other two (2) external. These outlets shall be used in the operation of drilling, grinding, lathe, drill up, compressor and Alternate Current (AC) welding and Metal Inert Gas (MIG) welding.

The contractor shall provide and install the following equipment/tools for the truck workshop:

Following items shall be provided (brand name or equivalent), installed and anchored to the truck by the vendor as per attached drawing.

**ESPAÑOL:**

El contratista proveerá toda la mano de obra, materiales y transporte para adaptar dos (2) camiones de 11 toneladas a carro talleres. Estos camiones serán usados por las Fuerzas Militares de Colombia para el mantenimiento de equipos a lo largo del país, donde hay equipo del ejército en malas condiciones. El carro taller contendrá las siguientes especificaciones para el cuerpo del chasis (carrocería):

**CARROCERIA: Esto incluye la descripción del chasis (carrocería) y los principales equipos que el contratista proveerá e instalará dentro de cada carro taller.**

La estructura externa del carro taller será laminado en acero galvanizado calibre 14, estructura en perfilaría rectangular acerada de 0.9 milímetros de espesor, vigas estructurales de hierro acerado de 3 pulgadas y de 6 pulgadas.

Largo 7.20 metros.

Ancho 2.70 metros.

Altura interior 2.35 metros.

Dos (2) Ventanas de ventilación una por cada lado, de 1.60 metros de largo por 65 centímetros de altura con vidrios de seguridad.

Un (1) Aire acondicionado de 12.000 BTU instalado en la parte delantera interna del carro taller a 1.70 metros del piso del furgón, la unidad condensadora estará ubicada en la parte delantera externa a la altura del techo del furgón con sus soportes y anclajes. El contratista suministrara, instalará y conectará (a la planta eléctrica), en el carro taller, nueve (9) tomas dobles de 110 voltios, dos (2) tomas de 220 voltios y tres (3) tomas trifásicas: una interna y dos externas, estas tomas eléctricas se utilizaran en la operación del taladro, pulidoras, esmeril, torno, taladro de pie, compresor y equipos de soldadura corriente alterna (AC) y de Metal Gas Inerte (MIG).
