

Demonstration Notice
March 3, 2011

Please be aware of the planned demonstrations and large gatherings indicated below planned over the next four days. Expect large crowds and heavy traffic.

- Thursday, 03 March:

- At approximately 3:00 PM, a vehicle demonstration is planned to begin near the Pearl Roundabout and proceed along the following route (see map): King Faisal Hwy to Al Fateh Road, to Shaikh Isa Bin Salman Hwy, to Shaikh Khalifa Hwy and ending at the Pearl Roundabout.
- At approximately 4:00-7:00 PM, a demonstration is planned near City Centre Mall.

- Friday, 04 March:

- At approximately 1:00 PM, demonstrations are planned in the Al Eker area and the Nowaidrat area.
- At approximately 1:00 PM, demonstrators are planning to gather at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and move to the Pearl Roundabout.

- Sunday, 06 March: At approximately 9:00 AM, a demonstration is planned in the Gudaibiya Area.

- There continue to be on-going demonstrations near the Pearl Roundabout, and numerous demonstrations have been reported at the Salmaniya Medical Center in recent days.

US Citizens are advised to avoid those areas.

There is no indication that westerners are being threatened or targeted; however, spontaneous demonstrations and clashes are still capable of taking place.

If urgent medical care is required, other possible alternatives to Salmaniya Medical Center are listed below:

We remind American citizens that even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. American citizens are therefore urged to avoid the areas of demonstrations if possible, and to exercise caution if within the vicinity of any demonstrations. American citizens should stay current with media coverage of local events and be aware of their surroundings at all times.
