

# An Analysis of the 2014 U.S. Midterm Elections

Professor Mark Miller will be analyzing the U.S. midterm election results at a free lecture arranged by the American Resource Center on Monday, November 10, at 17:00. His lecture will be followed by comments from professor Rani-Henrik Andersson from the University of Helsinki and Gottlieb Duwan from the Political-Economic Section of the U.S. Embassy in Helsinki.

Professor Mark C. Miller holds the Bicentennial Fulbright Distinguished Chair in the North American Studies Department at the University of Helsinki in Finland for the 2014-15 academic year. He will teach courses such as Introduction to American and Canadian Legal Systems, Civil Rights and Civil Liberties in the U.S., and Introduction to American Government and Politics. His research project will be examining how the Finnish courts and judges have adapted to Finland's membership in the European Union.

Miller's research interests include the interactions between Congress and the courts; constitutional law issues involving the powers of Congress; and comparisons of judicial politics in North America and Western Europe.
