# STATEMENT OF WORK

## CONSTRUCTION SERVICES TO PROVIDE PAVING AT AEA DRIVE WAY

### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 The U.S. Embassy in Accra, Ghana has a requirement to obtain Construction Services to **Provide Paving at AEA Driveway[commissary]**

This project consists of provision of all necessary supplies and labor to **Provide Paving for AEA drive way at the U.S. Embassy located at 4<sup>th</sup> Circular Road Cantonments, Accra.**

This shall include the following three (3) options:

#### OPTION 1 – Quote for Pavers

- Excavate to remove all of top soil on site measuring 2,450 Meter square
- Cut all exposed tree roots and ensure they do not interfere with the construction
- Excavate base for the paving ensuring it gets to a depth of 12"
- Properly compact the base of the excavation and ensure that it is equally levelled to a depth of 10"
- Provide and fill excavation with grade one laterite to a height of 6" and compact
- Provide 3" PVC Pipe conduit across the area before quarry dust, for future electrical work
- Provide concrete curb as required
- Provide and lay approved polythene sheet over compacted laterite base
- Provide and spread quarry dust
- Supply and lay 4" x 8" concrete pavers
- Spread quarry dust over pavers to fill gaps and brush off the excess quarry dust
- Clear all debris off site

#### OPTION 2 –Quote for Concrete Slab

- Excavate to remove all of top soil on site measuring 2,450 Meter square
- Cut all exposed tree roots and ensure they do not interfere with the construction
- Excavate base for the paving ensuring it gets to a depth of 12"

- Properly compact the base of the excavation and ensure that it is equally levelled to a depth of 12"
- Provide and fill excavation with grade one laterite to a height of 6" and compact
- Provide 3" PVC Pipe conduit across for future electrical work
- Provide concrete curb as required
- Set out for the height of the slab 6"
- Provide appropriate formwork
- Provide road reinforcement mesh (1/2" rebar in 6"x 6") as required
- Provide and pour ready mix concrete 1:3:6
- Provide expansion joint as required
- Provide a smooth float finish for the surface of the slab
- Provide appropriate curing
- Clear all debris off site

#### OPTION 3 – BETUMINOUS ROAD SURFACE

- Excavate to remove all of top soil on site measuring 2,450 Meter square
- Cut all exposed tree roots and ensure they do not interfere with the construction
- Excavate base for the paving ensuring it gets to a depth of 10"
- Properly compact the base of the excavation and ensure that it is equally levelled to a depth of 10"
- Provide and fill excavation with grade one laterite to a height of 8" and compact
- Provide 3" PVC Pipe conduit across for future electrical work
- Provide concrete curb as required
- Provide appropriate formwork
- Provide and pour bitumen and chippings road finish and properly compact and cure
- Clear all debris off site

1.2 The facility on the American Mission Compound Located at the 4<sup>th</sup> Circular Cantonments, Accra  
All inspections shall be requested through the Embassy's Facility Manager [FM] or Contracting  
Officer Representative [COR].

1.3 Work shall be completed as expeditiously as possible. There shall be a lot of activity going on

### 2.0 **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

2.1 The Contractor shall provide all the equipment, tools and supervision as needed to complete the  
services that meet the technical requirements in this Statement of Work [SOW]. It is expected  
that the Contractor shall partner closely with Embassy personnel.

2.2 The work shall be executed in a diligent manner in accordance with a negotiated firm fixed price  
and performance period.

2.3 The Contractor shall have limited access to or be admitted into any structure outside the areas  
designated for the project except with permission by the Embassy. The Contractor shall address  
the impact of the consequent disruption and provide for a continuing level of operation for  
continuous occupation of the residence during works.

### 4.0 **CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION**

4.1 The Contractor shall not conduct any work that is beyond this Statement of Work and  
accompanying specifications unless directed in writing by the Contracting Officer [CO]. Any work  
done by the Contractor beyond this SOW and accompanying specifications without direction from  
the CO will be at the Contractor's own risk and at no cost to the Embassy.

4.2 The Contracting Officer shall provide a Notice to Proceed [NTP] to the Contractor. No work shall  
be initiated until the NTP is issued by the CO.

4.3 The Contracting Officer may designate more than one individual to serve as the Contracting  
Officer's Representative [COR]. The Contractor will be furnished evidence of COR appointments,  
including explicit authority delegated to each COR and their responsibilities.

4.4.1 The Embassy does not make representations or warranties of whatsoever kind or nature, either  
expressed or implied, as to the quality, level of completion, accuracy, extent of compliance with  
the standards, codes and requirements described or referred to in this SOW, or the extent of  
coordination between or among the documents provided to the Contractor.

- 4.4.2 The Embassy's review, approval, or acceptance of, or payment for the services required under this contract shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this contract or any cause of action against the Contractor arising out of the performance of this contract.
- 4.5 The Embassy has the right to inspect and test all services called for by the contract, to the extent practicable at all times and places during the term of the contract. The Facilities Office may perform quality assurance inspections [QAI] and tests during the work to confirm the work is according to the SOW.
- 4.6 The Contracting Officer has the authority to issue a temporary stop order during the execution of any particular phase of this SOW. This authority may be executed when the Embassy requires time for official functions, or is in possession of specific credible information indicating that the lives of Embassy personnel are immediately threatened and that the execution of the project will increase the Embassy's vulnerability. The Contractor shall promptly notify the CO that work has been stopped.
- 4.7 If any of the Contractor's services do not conform to the contract requirements, the COR may require the Contractor to perform the services again in conformity with the contract requirements. The Embassy may by contract or otherwise, perform the services and charge the Contractor any cost incurred by the Embassy that is directly related to the performance of such service or terminate the contract for default.
- 4.8 The Embassy has the right to terminate this contract of convenience at any time in whole, or from time to time, if the Contracting Officer determines it is in the interest of the Embassy.

## **5.0 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR**

- 5.1 Contractor shall provide all necessary materials needed to complete the project as specified. Specifications of all materials to be used must be given in the bid (include pictures and drawings if necessary).
- 5.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, and the coordination of the work and other services furnished under this contract. The Contractor shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its works and other services.
- 5.2 The Contractor shall identify a Project Site Manager who shall be responsible for the overall management of the project and shall represent the Contractor on the site during the work. The Project Site Manager shall be approved by the COR.
- 5.2.1 All documentation produced for this project will become the ownership of the Embassy at the completion of this project.
- 5.3 Any cost associated with services subcontracted by the Contractor shall be borne by and be the complete responsibility of the Contractor under the fixed price of this contract.
- 5.4 The Contractor is responsible for safety and shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety and similar matters. The Contractor shall promptly report all accidents resulting in lost time, disabling, or fatal injuries to the COR.

- 5.5 The Contractor shall be and remain liable to the Embassy in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the Embassy caused by the Contractor's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this contract. The rights and remedies for the Embassy provided for under this contract are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

## **6.0 PRE-WORK REQUIREMENTS**

- 6.1 The Contractor shall examine all the documents and visit the site to fully inform themselves of all the conditions and limitations applied to the work and submit a firm fixed price cost proposal for all the work. No subsequent cost allowance will be made to the Contractor for neglect of the existing conditions.
- 6.2 Provide a statement that the Contractor's company and all personnel are experienced in construction services or similar to type and scope required for the work.

## **7.0 WORK REQUIREMENTS**

- 7.1 No work shall begin until approvals of the Pre-work Submittals are accepted by the COR.
- 7.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for all required materials not provided by the Embassy, equipment and personnel to manage, administer, and supervise the project. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner as determined by the COR.
- 7.3 Equipment and materials shall be carefully handled, properly stored, and adequately protected to prevent damage before and during the work, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. Damaged or defective items shall be replaced. The contractor will be responsible for security of all materials and equipment.
- 7.4 The Contractor will be provided with a storage and staging area as determined by the COR. The Contractor shall be responsible for restoring the area to its original condition at the completion of the work. The Contractor shall be responsible for repair of any damage incurred to buildings or pavement as a result of storage activities. The Contractor is responsible for obtaining any additional off compound storage areas as required.
- 7.5 The Contractor shall at all times keep the work area free from accumulation of waste materials. Upon completing the work, the Contractor shall remove all temporary facilities and leave the project site in a clean and orderly condition acceptable to the COR.
- 7.6 The Contractor shall perform the work at the site during the Embassy's normal workday hours, unless agreed upon with the COR.
- 7.7 At the end of each work day, or notification of a temporary stop order, the Contractor shall lower and fixed all temporary work platforms and/or harnesses. Contractor shall notify the COR of the temporary barricade locations. Beginning the next workday, the contractor shall remove the temporary barricades before continuing the project.
- 7.8 Storm Protection - Should warnings of wind of gale force or stronger be issued, the Contractor shall take every practicable precaution to minimize danger to person, the work and adjacent property. Precautions shall include, but not be limited to, closing all openings, removing all loose materials, tools and equipment from exposed locations, and other temporary work.

- 7.9 Cleanup - The Contractor shall keep the work area, including storage areas, free from accumulations of waste materials on a daily basis and comply with all federal, state and local regulations pertaining to the storage, transport and disposal of wastes. The Contractor shall not use Embassy waste disposal facilities including garbage cans, trash piles or dumpsters.
- 7.10 Landscape Restoration - The surfaces of all unpaved areas disturbed by work activities shall be sodded with an approved grass native to the sodded area as approved by the COR. These shall include areas which existing pavement is removed, areas where excavation takes place, and areas where existing sod is killed or compacted by work activities. Landscape shrubs killed or damaged by work activities shall be replaced with same species and size.

## **8.0 CRITERIA**

- 8.1 The Contractor work shall be in accordance with International building codes and standards.

## **9.0 DELIVERABLE SCHEDULE**

- 9.1 The Contractor shall commence work under this contract promptly, execute the work diligently, and achieve final completion and acceptance including final cleanup of the premises within the period specified.

## **10.0 PROJECT SECURITY**

- 10.1 The work to be performed under this contract requires that the Contractor, its employees and sub-contractors submit corporate, financial and personnel information for review by the Embassy. Information submitted by the Contractor will not be disclosed beyond the Embassy.
- 10.2 The Contractor shall submit this information including company vehicle requirements within 10 working days of the Notice to Proceed.

## **11.0 PAYMENTS**

- 11.1 The Contractor shall submit his invoice, with the appropriate backup documents to the COR after completion. The COR will determine if the invoice is complete and proper as submitted. The COR also will determine if billed services have been satisfactorily performed and if expenses billed are correct. If it is determined that the amount billed is incorrect, the COR will within seven days, request the Contractor to submit a revised invoice.

(2) The Contractor shall make available at its offices at all reasonable times the records, materials, and other evidence for examination, audit, or reproduction, until 3 years after final payment under this contract or for any shorter period specified in FAR Subpart 4.7, Contractor Records Retention, of the other clauses of this contract. If this contract is completely or partially terminated, the records relating to the work terminated shall be made available for 3 years after any resulting final termination settlement. Records relating to appeals under the disputes clause or to litigation or the settlement of claims arising under or relating to this contract shall be made available until such appeals, litigation, or claims are finally resolved.

(3) As used in this clause, records include books, documents, accounting procedures and practices, and other data, regardless of type and regardless of form. This does not require the Contractor to create or maintain any record that the Contractor does not maintain in the ordinary course of business or pursuant to a provision of law.

(e)(1) [This paragraph applies only if award is made to a U.S. firm, except for item (vii) which applies to all orders.] Notwithstanding the requirements of the clauses in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), and (d) of this clause, the Contractor is not required to flow down any FAR clause, other than those in this paragraph (e)(1) in a subcontract for commercial items. Unless otherwise indicated below, the extent of the flow down shall be as required by the clause—

(i) 52.203-13, Contractor Code of Business Ethics and Conduct (APR 2010) (Pub. L. 110-252, Title VI, Chapter 1 (41 U.S.C. 251 note)).

(ii) 52.219-8, Utilization of Small Business Concerns (JAN 2011) (15 U.S.C. 637(d)(2) and (3)), in all subcontracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities. If the subcontract (except subcontracts to small business concerns) exceeds \$650,000 (\$1.5 million for construction of any public facility), the subcontractor must include 52.219-8 in lower tier subcontracts that offer subcontracting opportunities.
