NOTICE AND DECLARATION ON PRE-DEPARTURE MARRIAGE

Refugee/Asylee Relative Petition - Form I-730

Notice

If you are approved by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) as a derivative refugee or derivative asylee, you may accompany or follow-to-join your parent(s) in the United States. You are eligible for this benefit because you are unmarried and were under 21 years of age at the time your parent was admitted to the United States as a refugee or was granted asylum in the United States. If you marry before arriving in the United States, you can no longer derive refugee or asylee status from your parent.

Should you marry either before or after your USCIS or Department of State (DOS) interview, you must notify USCIS or DOS of your marriage before you depart for the United States. This notice can be made through the office where your interview is held.

If you marry and travel to the United States without notifying USCIS or DOS, you could face termination of your derivative refugee or asylum status and removal from the United States.
