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6. INSTALLATION:

- These tactical radios will be used and installed in twenty-five (25) pick up vehicles used by Guatemalan Government agencies. Installation will be scheduled at the Contractor’s Facilities.
- Upon conclusion of installation software and manuals will become property of US Embassy/INL.

End User Training:

- Contractor will be required to deliver training on the correct use and operation of the equipment to the end users.

7. WARRANTY:

- Warranty should be provided on site where equipment is installed
- The Awarded Company needs to provide 1-year warranty over the equipment.

8. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

All items will be inspected to verify the correct product is received in good working condition. The contractor is required to replace any defective items at no additional cost to the Government. Equipment will be inspected to ensure proper functioning.

The Contractor shall contact the GSO Procurement whenever equipment is being upgraded or replaced.

9. QUOTATION SUBMISSION:

Quotation must include:

- Firm-fixed prices on a unit and extended basis
- Technical specifications and product data to verify the quoted product meets the required specifications
- Name of manufacturer and model number of the quoted product
- Installation of equipment
- Warranty information
- Proposed delivery time
- VAT must be included in price

11. EVALUATION CRITERIA:

Award will be made to the lowest price-technically acceptable vendor submitting a quotation conforming to all requirements stated in this RFQ.

The Government reserves the right to reject a quotation that is technically unacceptable or unreasonably low or high in price. The quoter must be able to demonstrate that it has the necessary resources to provide on-time delivery and high level of quality.

The Government reserves the right to reject quotations submitted without the documentation required of this RFQ.

REPRESENTATION BY CORPORATION REGARDING AN UNPAID DELINQUENT TAX LIABILITY OR A FELONY CRIMINAL CONVICTION UNDER ANY FEDERAL LAW (DEVIATION PIB 2014-21) (SEPTEMBER 2014)

(a) In accordance with section 7073 of Division K of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2014 (Public Law 113-76) none of the funds made available by that Act may be used to enter into a contract with any corporation that –

- (1) Was convicted of a felony criminal violation under any Federal law within the

preceding 24 months, where the awarding agency has direct knowledge of the conviction, unless the agency has considered, in accordance with its procedures, that this further action is not necessary to protect the interests of the Government; or

(2) Has any unpaid Federal tax liability that has been assessed for which all judicial and administrative remedies have been exhausted or have lapsed, and that is not being paid in a timely manner pursuant to an agreement with the authority responsible for collecting the tax liability, where the awarding agency has direct knowledge of the unpaid tax liability, unless the Federal agency has considered, in accordance with its procedures, that this further action is not necessary to protect the interests of the Government.

For the purposes of section 7073, it is the Department of State's policy that no award may be made to any corporation covered by (1) or (2) above, unless the Procurement Executive has made a written determination that suspension or debarment is not necessary to protect the interests of the Government.

(b) Offeror represents that—

(1) It is [] is not [] a corporation that was convicted of a felony criminal violation under a Federal law within the preceding 24 months.

(2) It is [] is not [] a corporation that has any unpaid Federal tax liability that has been assessed for which all judicial and administrative remedies have been exhausted or have lapsed, and that is not being paid in a timely manner pursuant to an agreement with the authority responsible for collecting the tax liability.
