The U.S. Interests Section (USINT) is seeking a U.S. Citizen Eligible Family Member (USEFM), Eligible Family Member (EFM), with the required work permit for employment in Cuba for the position of Program Coordinator in the Public Diplomacy Section (PAS).

BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION

Serves as Program Coordinator for the U.S. Interests Section's half-million dollar Outreach program to members of Cuban civil society. Coordinates the purchase of outreach materials, oversees their distribution and manages their inventory. Is responsible for tracking the Outreach budget and procurement plan in conjunction with FMO and GSO. Plans and executes programs to increase information dissemination, U.S.-Cuban interaction and mutual understanding.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

NOTE: All applicants must address each selection criterion detailed below with specific and comprehensive information supporting each item.

- 1) University degree or equivalent is required.
- 2) Three to five years administrative/government services/para-professional experience is required.
- 3) Procurement Training is required.

- 4) English and Spanish level III (good working knowledge) spoken/written is required. Test to be administered by the HR department.
- 5) Must have good working knowledge of Microsoft Office (Microsoft Word, Excel). Test to be administered by the HR department.

ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Management will consider nepotism/conflict of interest, budget, and residency (employment eligibility) status in determining successful candidacy.
2. Current employees serving a probationary period are not eligible to apply.
3. Currently employed U.S. Citizen EFMs who hold a FMA appointment are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment.
4. Currently employed NORs hired under a Personal Services Agreement (PSA) are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment, unless currently hired into a position with a When Actually Employed (WAE) work schedule.

TO APPLY

Interested applicants for this position must submit the following or the application will not be considered:

1. Application for employment (DS-174) is required.
2. Candidates who claim U.S. Veterans preference must provide a copy of their Form DD-214 with their application.
3. Any other documentation (e.g., essays, certificates, awards, copies of degrees earned) that addresses the qualification requirements of the position as listed above.

DEFINITIONS

1. USEFM: A type of EFM that is eligible for direct hire employment on either a Family Member Appointment (FMA) or Temporary Appointment (TEMP) provided s/he meets all of the following criteria:
 - a) U.S. citizen; and
 - b) The spouse *or domestic partner* (as defined in [3 FAM](#) 1610) of the sponsoring employee, or a child of the sponsoring employee who is an unmarried *child* at least 18 years old; and
 - c) Listed on the travel orders *or approved Form* [OF-126](#), *Foreign Service Residence and Dependency Report*, of a sponsoring

employee, i.e., a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member who is permanently assigned to or stationed abroad at a U.S. mission, or at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; and who is under chief of mission authority, and either:

(a) Resides at the sponsoring employee's post of assignment abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; or

(b) Resides at an involuntary separate maintenance allowance (ISMA) location authorized under [3 FAM 3232.2](#). If residing at an ISMA location, the individual will not be listed on the sponsoring officer's travel orders, but will have a Form [SF-1190](#), *Foreign Allowances Application, Grant and Report*, processed authorizing ISMA.

2. Eligible family members (*EFM*):

a) Children who are unmarried and under 21 years of age or, regardless of age, are *unmarried and* incapable of self support. The term "*children*" shall include natural offspring, step-children, adopted children, and those under *permanent* legal guardianship (*at least until age 18*), or *comparable permanent custody arrangement*, of the employee or spouse when dependent upon and normally residing with the guardian or *custodial party*; ... and

b) Spouse or same-sex domestic partner as defined in [3 FAM 1610](#).

3. Member of Household: A MOH is a person who: 1) Has accompanied, but is not/not on the travel orders of a U.S. citizen Foreign or Civil Service employee or uniform service member permanently assigned to or stationed at a U.S. Foreign service post or establishment abroad; 2) Has been declared by the sponsoring employee to the Chief of Mission as part of his/her household; and 3) Resides at post with the sponsoring employee.

4. Ordinarily Resident (OR): A citizen of the host country or a citizen of another country who has shifted the main residency focus to the host country and has the required work and/or residency permits for employment in country.

5. Not-Ordinarily Resident (NOR): Typically NORs are US Citizen EFM's and EFM's of FS, GS, and uniformed service members who are eligible for employment under an American USG pay plan, on the travel orders and under Chief of Mission authority, or other personal having diplomatic privileges and immunities.
