
SECTION I. STATEMENT OF WORK
SHO80013Q0032

This work includes but is not limited to the following:

1. Removal of existing stone veneer at the front façade of the Chancery building in the location shown in attached drawing. (670 square meters)
2. Removal of the stone veneer of the planters along Avenida la Paz as shown in location plan drawing. (230 square meters)
3. Labor work to install porcelanate tiles provided by the Embassy. The specified cementitious glue to install the porcelanate tiles will be provided by the Contractor. (900 square meters)
4. Masonry repair work related to the removal of existing stone veneer. That is; fill up of holes in the walls, leveling and/or preparation of surface prior to installation of porcelanate finish, fill up the gap between the concrete sidewalk and the new veneered walls.
5. Pick up and dispose of stone pieces resulted from removal of veneer.
6. Fill all cracks and fissures.
7. Clean out all weep hole drains.
8. The contractor must complete the job within sixty (60) days from the award of the contract.
9. After job completion the contractor shall replace and install all loose, missing or fallen stone veneers for a 12 month period.

Special instructions

1. The Contractor shall execute the work related to this project following strict safety measures at all times. The Personnel must be using appropriate personal protective equipment; hearing protection, dust masks, gloves, etc.
2. The scaffolding must be safe to use and must be attached at the top existing metal bars for addition stability. The personnel using the scaffolds must be harnessed for safety. Embassy safety inspector shall inspect the work conditions to ensure that safety measures are being followed.
3. Construction debris shall not be accumulated at the sidewalk for more than one day. It must be promptly removed from the site.

SECTION II. BASIS FOR AWARD.

The Government intends to award a Purchase Order resulting from this RFQ to the lowest priced, technically acceptable offeror who is a responsible Contractor.

The Government reserves the right to reject proposals that are unreasonably low or high in price.

- (3) Delivery time.
- (4) Twelve month warranty for loose, missing or fallen pieces according to item 9 in section I.
- (5) Evidence that the offeror/quoter has all licenses and permits required by local law (i.e. Certificate of Registration under Honduran Law)
- (6) List of clients, demonstrating prior experience with relevant past performance information and references.
