POSITION: Consular Clerk/Cashier FSN-6;

WORK HOURS: Full time; 40 hours/week, Monday to Friday.

SALARY: Ordinarily Resident: from ISK 3,968,470 p.a. to 5,159,008.
Position Grade FSN-6.
NOTE: Meal allowance of ISK 210,000p.a. and miscellaneous benefit allowance of ISK 125,000p.a. are paid in addition to the wages.

The U.S. Embassy in Reykjavik is seeking an individual for the position of Consular Clerk/Cashier in the Consular Section.

BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION

Incumbent operates the main Embassy switchboard and serves as the principal sub cashier for the Consular Section. In addition, the incumbent is the Embassy receptionist. The incumbent fields all incoming phone calls for Post and answers the majority of incoming Consular inquiries.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

NOTE: All applicants must address each selection criterion detailed below with specific and comprehensive information addressing each requirement.

1. EDUCATION

Successful completion of secondary school required.

2. PRIOR WORK EXPERIENCE

One year of clerical work, incorporating substantial elements of customer service is required.

3. LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY:

Level 4, fluent English and Icelandic is required.

4. SKILLS AND ABILITIES

-Well developed interpersonal skills and the ability to provide and maintain a professional level of service to all Embassy customers is required.

-A demonstrated ability to use Microsoft Windows-based computers and proficiency in using Microsoft Office is required.

-The ability to work effectively and tactfully in a loosely structured, fluid and collegial workplace is required.

SELECTION PROCESS

Applicant ability to meet the above required qualifications may be formally evaluated as part of the selection process.

When equally qualified, US Citizen Eligible Family Members (USEFMs) and U.S. Veterans will be given preference. Therefore, it is essential that the candidate address the qualifications outlined above in the application.

ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Management will consider nepotism/conflict of interest, budget, and residency status in determining successful candidacy.
2. Current employees serving a probationary period are not eligible to apply.
3. Currently employed US Citizen EFM's who hold a FMA appointment are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment.
4. Currently employed NORs hired under a Personal Services Agreement (PSA) are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment.

TO APPLY

Interested applicants for this position must submit the following to ensure full consideration of their application:

1. Application for U.S. Federal Employment (SF-171 or [DS-174](#)); or
2. A current resume or curriculum vitae that provides the same information as an DS-174; plus
3. Candidates who claim U.S. Veterans preference must provide a copy of their Form DD-214 with their application.
4. Any other documentation (e.g., essays, certificates, awards, copies of degrees earned) that addresses the qualification requirements of the position as listed above.

DEFINITIONS

1. USEFM: A type of EFM that is eligible for direct hire employment on either a Family Member Appointment (FMA) or Temporary Appointment (TEMP) provided s/he meets all of the following criteria:

--US citizen;

--Spouse or dependent who is at least age 18;

--Listed on the travel orders of a Foreign or Civil Service or uniformed service member permanently assigned to or stationed at a US Foreign Service post or establishment abroad with a USG agency that is under COM authority;

--Is resident at the sponsoring employee's or uniform service member's post of assignment abroad, approved safehaven abroad, or alternate safehaven abroad; and

--Does not receive a USG annuity or pension based on a career in the US Civil, Foreign, or uniform services.

2. EFM: Family Members at least age 18 listed on the travel orders of a Foreign of Civil Service or uniformed service member permanently assigned to or stationed to a US Foreign Service post or establishment abroad with a USG agency that is under COM authority who do not meet the definition of USEFM above.

3. Member of Household: A MOH is a person who: 1) Has accompanied, but is not/not on the travel orders of a U.S. citizen Foreign or Civil Service employee or uniform service member permanently assigned to or stationed at a U.S. Foreign service post or establishment abroad; 2) Has been declared by the sponsoring employee to the Chief of Mission as part of his/her household; and 3) Resides at post with the sponsoring employee.

4. Ordinarily Resident (OR): A citizen of the host country or a citizen of another country who has shifted the main residency focus to the host country and has the required work and/or residency permits for employment in country.

5. Not-Ordinarily Resident (NOR): Typically NORs are US Citizen EFMs and EFMs of FS, GS, and uniform service members who are on the travel orders and under Chief of Mission authority, or other personnel having diplomatic privileges and immunities.

TAXES

U.S. Citizens/Legal Permanent Residents: FICA contributions, U.S. Federal Income Tax and state tax withholdings shall be deducted in accordance with regulations and rulings of the Social Security Administration and the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, respectively. The employee may also be obligated to file state income tax returns and obligated to pay foreign taxes, depending upon residency status and the host government's taxation laws. All tax liabilities arising from this employment are the employee's responsibility whether or not taxes are withheld by the government. Regular deductions for federal, state and FICA taxes will be made through the Financial Service Centers.
