 At a time when women were expected to "work, not think," twenty-five year old Henrietta Leavitt dared to break the rules. She was the first person to discover the scientific importance of a star's brightness. One of the best minds at the Harvard College Observatory, she noticed that certain stars had a fixed pattern to their changes, which later made it possible to measure greater distances and led to our present understanding of the universe. Leavitt's story is sure to inspire young women to follow her trail. Take a look!

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
