**Statement of Work  
for  
Information Management Unclassified Systems Maintenance and Support**

**DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES.** The contractor shall provide trained and experienced personnel to perform maintenance, repair, and provide hardware support services to servers, desktop PCs, printers, other network management related activities, and other duties and services as required to the American Embassy New Delhi and the American Center New Delhi. The contractor shall furnish all personnel, equipment, tools, materials, transportation, supervision, and other items and services necessary to perform all system tasks and functions, as outlined herein. The contractor must perform to the standards identified in the statement of work and according to Department of State security standards. The contractor must be able to pass the security clearance process responding to all requests completely and truthfully.

The contractor shall not commence the work that results due to change in needs, prior to issuance of a modification in the contract that has been funded. Any change in the requirement will be authorized or "ordered" through the issuance of individual modification by the Contracting Officer, for services that fall within the general scope of this statement of work. Only the Contracting Officer has authority to: (1) direct or negotiate any changes in the statement of work; (2) modify or extend the period of performance; (3) change the delivery schedule; (4) authorize reimbursement to the Contractor, any costs incurred during the performance of this contract; or (5) otherwise change any terms and conditions of this contract.

**1.0 BASIC NON PERSONAL SERVICES.** The contractor shall provide maintenance and support services for computer hardware, software, unclassified local area network (LAN) and Internet LAN. Services will adhere to and respect internal computer security and inventory controls. The contractor will accomplish all cable connections and additional cabling requirements including laying of backbone and data cables. The embassy will provide all the necessary spare parts, cables, hardware, software and patches to the contractor for carrying out the repairs. All system data must be protected from disaster loss.

**1.1 LAN Services.** The contractor must support Microsoft XP, Microsoft Office products and any other leading LAN product adopted and accepted by the Department of State throughout the duration of the contract. Services for the LAN system include initial pre-purchase consulting, cabling, implementation and integration. The contractor must ensure all computer stations are operating properly and communicating with the unclassified LAN.

The contractor must ensure that within the constraints of locally controllable parameters, the users must be able to access their e-mail, their file directories, and the organization home page. The contractor shall perform LAN upgrades as new software or hardware becomes available.

The contractor shall analyze, identify, and correct local problems within the system, as identified by the locally-engaged staff working in the Information System Center. The contractor should be able to image/ghost/replicate Client Workstation images by using software provided.

**1.2. Preventive Maintenance.** All computer desktop clients and printers shall be placed on a routine preventive and corrective maintenance schedule of cleaning, vacuuming, and servicing every six months. The contractor shall maintain all preventive maintenance records and shall provide an annual accounting of this activity for each serviced piece of equipment. Additionally, the contractor shall make available a history card record for each equipment.

**1.3. Software Upgrades.** The contractor will install and update all network software components, as upgrades become available through Department of State channels. All system data must be protected from disaster loss.

**1.4. Inventory Control.** All computer components and peripherals are accountable. The contractor must cooperate and assist in the maintenance of locally-established inventory controls of software, hardware, and peripherals.

**1.5. Troubleshooting And Repair.** The scope of service includes diagnosing and rectifying operating system, application software, and other hardware related problems on servers and client computers; upgrading the desktop PC software from time to time, installing software patches; any problem with the system must be isolated and repaired by the contractor. If problems are found, the contractor will troubleshoot the hardware, software, and communications equipment to determine the source of problems. The contractor shall then perform the appropriate maintenance on those components which fall within the scope of this statement of work. All the equipment shall be repaired within the premises of embassy/American Center and no equipment or part shall be removed from the site for maintenance or repair.

**2. SERVICE DELIVERY SUMMARY AND QUALITY ASSURANCE PLAN.**

This plan is designed to provide an effective surveillance method to promote effective contractor performance. The QAP provides a method for the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) to monitor contractor performance, advise the contractor of unsatisfactory performance, and notify the Contracting Officer of continued unsatisfactory performance. The contractor, not the Government, is responsible for management and quality control to meet the terms of the contract. The role of the Government is to conduct quality assurance to ensure that contract standards are achieved.

a. **SURVEILLANCE.** The COR will receive and document all complaints from Government personnel regarding the services provided. If appropriate, the COR will send the complaints to the Contractor for corrective action.

b. **STANDARD.** The performance standard is provided in the matrix above and that the Government receives no more than one (1) customer complaint per month. The COR shall notify the Contracting Officer of the complaints so that the Contracting Officer may take appropriate action to enforce the inspection clause (FAR 52.212.4, Contract Terms and Conditions- Commercial Items (May 2001), if any of the services exceed the standard.

c. **PROCEDURES.**

(a) If any Government personnel observe unacceptable services, either incomplete work or required services not being performed they should immediately contact the COR.

(b) The COR will complete appropriate documentation to record the complaint.

(c) If the COR determines the complaint is invalid, the COR will advise the complainant. The COR will retain the annotated copy of the written complaint for his/her files.

(d) If the COR determines the complaint is valid, the COR will inform the Contractor and give the Contractor additional time to correct the defect, if additional time is available. The COR shall determine how much time is reasonable.

(e) The COR shall, as a minimum, orally notify the Contractor of any valid complaints.

(f) If the Contractor disagrees with the complaint after investigation of the site and challenges the validity of the complaint, the Contractor will notify the COR. The COR will review the matter to determine the validity of the complaint.

(g) The COR will consider complaints as resolved unless notified otherwise by the complainant.

(h) Repeat customer complaints are not permitted for any services. If a repeat customer complaint is received for the same deficiency during the service period, the COR will contact the Contracting Officer for appropriate action under the Inspection clause.

**3. GOVERNMENT FURNISHED PROPERTY AND SERVICES.** The contractor shall be provided office space with local calling telephone access, as well as workspace in which maintenance and repair activity can take place. These spaces will not be dedicated, but may be shared and used by locally engaged staff. All work done on U.S. government equipment is to be done on the premises. No equipment may be removed from the premises unless specifically approved by the ISO or the Computer Management Specialist.

#### **4. GENERAL INFORMATION.**

**4.1. QUALITY CONTROL.** Contractor is encouraged to develop and maintain a quality program to ensure services are performed in accordance with commonly accepted commercial

practices. The contractor should develop and implement procedures to identify, prevent, and ensure non-recurrence of defective services. As a minimum, the contractor shall develop quality control procedures that address the areas identified in paragraph 2, Service Delivery Summary.

**4.2. QUALITY ASSURANCE.** The government will evaluate the contractor's performance throughout the life of the contract, and will notify the contractor when insufficient quality controls have resulted in situations in excess of the established performance thresholds, identified in paragraph 2, Service Delivery Summary.

**4.3. GOVERNMENT REMEDIES.** The contracting officer shall follow the Contract Terms and Conditions - Commercial Items, for contractor's failure to perform satisfactory services or failure to correct non-conforming services. The contracting officer shall follow FAR 52.212.4, Contract Terms and Conditions - Commercial Items (May 1997).

**4.4. HOURS OF OPERATION.** The contractor shall provide service Monday through Saturday, during the established working hours of the American Embassy New Delhi and the American Center, except on the announced official holidays.

**4.5. SECURITY REQUIREMENTS.** The contractor shall provide to the security offices of the American Embassy New Delhi, a list of the contractor's employees who will be servicing the contract and who may require on-site access. Additional information on each name will be likewise submitted, as requested by the individual security offices. No contractor personnel, other than those approved by the security office, will be permitted to work on the United States government equipment in fulfillment of the terms of the contract. These persons will have escorted access only. The contractor shall likewise choose to identify key personnel, not to exceed two persons for the Embassy, and one for the American Center, who will be the contractor's primary representative, and who may apply for and following a successful security background investigation, be granted a building security pass which will permit unescorted access to the unclassified sections of the Embassy or Consulate.

**4.6 ON-SITE SERVICES.** For the provision of On-site Services, the Contractor shall operate out of the U.S. Government's facility, on U.S. Government property, located at the address set forth below in the paragraph, "Place of Performance". If working in Government-provided space, the Contractor's employees shall abide by the Government's smoking policies.

The Contractor shall ensure that its employees and agents working on the U.S. Government premises shall observe all health and safety codes including participation in safety drills when directed either orally or by established signals, fire alarms, bomb threat alarms, etc. The

Contractor's employees shall know the Embassy's fire regulations and shall report fires immediately upon detection by using the nearest fire alarm or by telephoning the Marine guard.

**4.7 MINIMUM PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS.** All Contractor personnel providing services under this contract shall be fluent in English as well as Hindi and meet the following requirements. See also paragraph below, "Key Personnel", for requirements regarding Key Personnel.

**Site Manager(s)** - At each site, the Contractor shall provide a Site Manager who is experienced in LAN Support Services.

**Other Personnel** - The Contractor shall provide whatever other personnel are necessary to comply with the requirements of this contract.

**Other Considerations** – All Contractor personnel who provide services under this contract shall be acceptable to the Government in terms of personal conduct. Employment and staffing difficulties shall not be justification for failure to meet established schedules.

**Security** - After award, the Contractor has ten calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer a list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks. It is anticipated that security checks will take 15 to 20 days to perform. The Government reserves the right to deny access to U.S. owned and U.S. operated facilities to any individual. The Contractor shall provide the names, biographic data and police clearance on all Contractor personnel who shall be used on this contract prior to their utilization. The Government shall issue identity cards to approved Contractor personnel, each of whom shall display his/her card(s) on the uniform at all times while on Government property or while on duty at private residences. These identity cards are the property of the Government and the Contractor is responsible for their return upon termination of the contract, when an employee leaves Contractor service, or at the request of the Government.

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or resubmission of the application. Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants, a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This badge may be revoked at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

**Government Approval and Acceptance of Contractor Employees** - The Contractor shall subject its personnel to the Government's approval. All employees shall pass a suitable investigation conducted by the Contractor, including recommendation(s) from their respective supervisor(s). Also required is a police check covering criminal and/or subversive activities, a check of personal residence, and a credit investigation. All such investigations shall be provided in summary form to the COR for review and approval or disapproval. The contractor shall not use any employees under this contract without Government approval.

During the first 90 days of performance, the Contractor shall make no substitutions of key personnel unless the substitution is necessitated by illness, death, or termination of employment. The Contractor shall notify the COR within 10 calendar days after the occurrence of any of these events and provide a detailed explanation of the circumstances necessitating the proposed substitution, complete resume for the proposed substitute, and any additional information requested by the COR. The proposed substitute must possess qualifications comparable to the original key person, as well as satisfying any minimum standards set forth elsewhere in the solicitation/contract.

After the first 90 days, the Contractor may substitute a key person if the Contractor determines the change is necessary. However, prior to making that substitution, the contractor shall provide a complete resume for the proposed substitute, and any additional information requested by the Contracting Officer. The proposed substitute shall possess qualifications comparable to the original key person and meet the minimum standards set forth in the contract.

Whenever a Key Person substitution is requested, the project Manager shall sign the resumes, certifying that the resume is accurate and complete, and that the proposed replacement meets the required experience levels. The COR will notify the Contractor within 5 calendar days after receipt of all required information of the decision on the substitution. The COR shall confirm oral approvals or rejections in writing. The Government will modify the contract to reflect any changes in key personnel.

**5. PERSONAL INJURY, PROPERTY LOSS OR DAMAGE (LIABILITY)**

The Contractor shall assume absolute responsibility and liability for any and all personal injuries or death and property damage or losses suffered due to:

- 1) negligence of the Contractor's personnel in the performance of this contract; or
- 2) any cause arising from accidental, careless or irresponsible action of the Contractor's personnel.

The Contractor's assumption of absolute liability is independent of any insurance policies.

## **Insurance**

The Contractor, at its own expense, shall provide and maintain during the entire period of performance of this contract, whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall carry the following minimum insurance:
