


Remembering Elizabeth Taylor (1932 - 2011)

 Starring: Montgomery Clift, Elizabeth Taylor and Shelley Winters
 Winner of 6 Oscars
 Clift stars as George Eastman, a poor young man determined to win a place in respectable society and the heart of a beautiful socialite, while a factory girl whose dark secret threatens Eastman's professional and romantic prospects. Consumed with fear and desire, Eastman is ultimately driven to a desperate act of passion that unravels his world forever. (122 minutes)

 Starring: Elizabeth Taylor, Rock Hudson and James Dean
 Winner of an Oscar
 The story of a wealthy land owner and cattle rancher who marries a spoiled and wealthy Virginian. When the two return to his cattle empire in Texas, conflicts around race, class and changing traditions rise to epic proportions and test the unity of the family and surrounding community. 
August 5

 A bitter aging couple, with the help of alcohol, use a young couple to fuel anguish and emotional pain towards each other. (131 minutes)







Our Earth: Making Less Trash


Biomass: Energy from Plants and Animals


Nuclear Power






