**CONTINUATION OF SF1449 – SCHEDULE OF SUPPLIES/SERVICES (BLOCK 20): DESCRIPTION/SPECIFICATION OF WORK**

1. Conference Sessions (May 21<sup>st</sup> through May 24<sup>th</sup>): The contractor will provide the function room, services, and items required below.

- a. One (1) Function room for Plenary Sessions - from 6.00am through 07.00pm, 500sqm at minimum to accommodate approximately 90 people with standard PA system, seating style schedule as below:
- May 21: Classroom seating style with table for 90 personnel, 5 people/chairs per table, with head table on podium for up to 5 speakers.
  - May 22-23: Four (4) U-shape tables be set up in opposite corners of plenary room, with 15-20 seats on each table. Chairs will ring the exterior of each U-shaped table
  - May 24 (morning through 12.00noon) will have same seating style as above.  
May 24 (starting 14.30): classroom seating style with table for 90 personnel and head table for up to 5 speaker.

The room should have unobstructed view and be soundproof, no construction or renovation allowed in the venue.

- b. One (1) Function room for Press room - adjacent to the conference room, to accommodate 20 people with classroom seating style for 16 people and a head table for up to 4 people, for May 21, 09.30am – 11.30am.
- c. One (1) Secretariat room, adjacent to function room, 30sqm at minimum to accommodate 6 people, should be private and lockable room with 24 hours access (hold from May 20, at 8.00am through May 24 at 6.00pm).
- Room should have 4 work-stations (chair and desk) and facilities as per 1.f.2, for period of April 17 through 20.
- d. Coffee breaks at foyer:
- Two (2) times coffee break with tea, coffee, and two kinds of pastries, for 90 package, for four days
- e. One conference lunch buffet style per day, should be served in separate room, with roundtable set up for 7-10 people per table; consist of a mix local and western food with tea, coffee, juice, and free flow water for approximately 90 people, for four days.

  2. In secretariat room:
    - Four (4) dedicated internet access.

A concierge for troubleshooting any conference support activities is required.

- g. One large digital color event backdrop/banner for the Conference room, as podium background, size should fit with podium/size of conference room.

- h. Group photo (1 pose) to include printing for 90 people. Area should large enough, able to tier the participants, inside or outdoor location, platform/ladder to raise photographer. The photograph will be 8 inches x 14 inches size, landscape, and at resolution greater than 600 dpi.

Rooms and other required facilities/services: The contractor will provide free breakfast and lock the mini bar in each room and other snack requirements are individual traveler responsibility.

2. Standard rooms, single occupancy:

Personal Account: In addition to the rooms purchased under this contract, the Contractor provides ten (10) rooms for conference attendees for period of May 16<sup>th</sup> through 26<sup>th</sup>. These rooms are single occupancy (to include breakfast). The cost of these rooms is the responsibility of the conference attendees only (*personal account*); the Government will not be liable for any charges associated with these “blocked” rooms. Any unconfirmed rooms may be released 15 days prior to the period of performance for hotel use. Any cancellation charges for these rooms shall follow the hotel general policies with the attendee that is associated with the reserved room.

3. Provider should have Business Center facilities. All of the cost for business center must be charged based on actual cost.

**SECTION IV. EVALUATION FACTORS**

The Government intends to award a contract/purchase order resulting from this solicitation to the lowest priced, technically acceptable offeror/quoter who is a responsible contractor. The evaluation process shall include the following:

- (a) **COMPLIANCE REVIEW.** The Government will perform an initial review of proposals/quotations received to determine compliance with the terms of the solicitation. The Government may reject as unacceptable proposals/quotations that do not conform to the solicitation.
- (b) **TECHNICAL ACCEPTABILITY.** Technical acceptability will include a review of past performance

and experience as defined in Section 3, along with any technical information provided by the offeror with its proposal/quotation.

(c) PRICE EVALUATION. The lowest price will be determined by multiplying the offered prices times the estimated quantities in "Prices - Continuation of SF-1449, block 23", and arriving at a grand total, including all options. The Government reserves the right to reject proposals that are unreasonably low or high in price.

(d) RESPONSIBILITY DETERMINATION. The Government will determine contractor responsibility by analyzing whether the apparent successful offeror complies with the requirements of FAR 9.1, including:

- Adequate financial resources or the ability to obtain them;
- Ability to comply with the required performance period, taking into consideration all existing commercial and governmental business commitments;
