



2015 Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program

The United States-Israel Educational Foundation, which administers the Fulbright Program in Israel, plans to nominate approximately eight primary or secondary school teachers in any field who hold full-time positions, for teaching awards in the United States. The Program will take place from mid-August 2015 to mid-December 2015.

Teachers will be placed at a U.S. university graduate school of education and be assigned to a university faculty advisor. In addition, they will audit up to two classes, carry out their own project, observe and teach classes in local schools.

Eligibility:

At least five years of full-time teaching;

Evidence of leadership and experience in leading workshops or other professional development activities for their colleagues;

Possess sufficient oral and written English language skills to audit university courses and to teach, lead seminars and give presentations in U.S. schools;

A TOEFL score of at least 80 or IELTS score of at least 6.5.

Grant Benefits:

Tuition and fees;

Monthly maintenance allowance for duration of the grant for grantee only;

Limited health benefits for the grantee only for the duration of the grant;

Roundtrip airfare from Tel Aviv to the US academic institution.

Applicants must submit a completed application, together with accompanying documents and a TOEFL/IELTS test result by October 31, 2014.
