



PROF. ERSİN KALAYCIOĞLU

He is a Full Professor of Political Science at Sabancı University, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and formerly Rector (President) of Isik University, Istanbul, Turkey (2004 – 2007). Prof. Kalaycıoğlu is a student of comparative politics and specializes in political representation and participation. He has published on those two fields internationally. He authored and co-edited four books in Turkish on Comparative Political Participation, Turkish Political Life (co-edited), and Contemporary Political Science (text-book), Turkish Politics (co-edited) several editions of which have been published in the last two decades, and four books in English, one of which he co-edited, called *Turkey: Political, Social and Economic Challenges in the 1990s* (Leiden, New York, Köln: E. J. Brill, 1995), and authored *Turkish Dynamics: A Bridge Across Troubled Lands* (New York: Macmillan-Palgrave, 2005), and co-authored with Ali Çarkoğlu of Sabancı University *Turkish Democracy Today: Elections, Protest and Stability in an Islamic Society*, (London: I. B. Tauris, 2007). Dr. Kalaycıoğlu and Ali Çarkoğlu of Sabancı University also published a book on the changing characteristics of the socio-political orientations, values and attitudes in Turkey under the title of *The Rising Tide of Conservatism in Turkey*, (New York, Palgrave – Macmillan, 2009), and most recently edited a textbook with Deniz Kağnıcıoğlu of Anadolu University on Comparative Political Systems in Turkish in 2012. Prof. Kalaycıoğlu is functioning as a principal investigator in the Turkish applications of the annual global surveys of the International Social Survey Program (ISSP) with Ali Çarkoğlu of Koç University, Istanbul, Turkey since 2008.

Prof. Kalaycıoğlu has been a founding member of the Turkish Democracy Foundation (TDV), TESEV, Istanbul Policy Center (IPC), and a member of the Turkish Political Science Association (SITD), Turkish Social Science Association (TSBD), International Political Science Association (IPSA), the International Studies Association (ISA), Midwest Political Science Association (MPSA), and the Middle Eastern Studies Association of North America (MESA).
