INTERVIEW CHECKLIST FOR K APPLICANTS

Each applicant (including children) must submit original documents with *an original certified translation of any document* that is not in English, Arabic or Hebrew. You should also provide a PHOTOCOPY of each original document that you submit. If you fail to bring a copy of each original document on the day of your interview, you will be charged an extra fee for each copy. Fee will be charged based on the Department of State schedule of Fees: (http://travel.state.gov/visa/temp/types_1263.html#perm).

IMPORTANT NOTE: On the day of your interview, you should bring with you the DS-160 confirmation page (with barcode). Your visa interview will be delayed if you do not have the confirmation page with you.

For additional instructions, please refer to the VISA INSTRUCTIONS AND CHECKLIST FOR IMMIGRANT VISA APPLICANTS document that was previously provided when the petition was filed.

You will need to provide the following on the day of the interview for each applicant:

- Your appointment letter
- Your passport valid for at least eight months (please bring passports from other nationalities you have and expired passports)
- Birth certificate
- Two identical photographs
- Birth certificates of all unmarried children who will not immigrate with you at this time.
- Certificate of name change (if applicable)
- Marriage certificates (if applicable)
- Divorce certificates (if applicable)
- Death certificate (if applicable)
- Military record (if service is required by your country of nationality)
- Court and prison records (if applicable)

- ❑ Police certificates from your current country of residence and country of nationality if you resided in either for more than six months after the age of 16. You must also provide a police certificate from all countries where you have resided for over a year after the age of 16. All Palestinian applicants living in the West Bank must obtain for an Israeli Criminal Register Certificate either from the Israeli DCO (Civil Liaison Office) in the place of their residence or by requesting one online. You should apply for the Criminal Register Certificate at least four weeks before your interview. The Israeli Criminal Register Certificate will be sent to the U.S. Consulate directly by the Israeli National Police. - ❑ Medical exams report, conducted by a Consulate Panel Physician. If at all possible, your medical exam should be completed at least three weeks prior to your scheduled interview.
- ❑ Evidence of Financial Support: You must submit evidence that you will not be a financial burden to the U.S. Government such as a Form I-134 (recommended) from a sponsor with the form 1040. Form I-864 is not acceptable.
- ❑ K Visa Fee: The visa fee should be paid before your interview date, either in cash at any Israeli Postal Bank or Bank of Palestine location or online by credit card. For more information on how to pay the fee for a K visa please visit the following website: <http://jerusalem.usvisa-info.com>.
- ❑ PHOTOGRAPHS: You will need two identical photographs 2 inches by 2 inches (~50x50mm) in size with a neutral background taken within the last six months. The photographs should be taken with the applicant directly facing the camera. Head coverings are permitted; however, the photographs must clearly show the face of the applicant from the crown of the head (hairline) to the tip of the chin and from ear to ear. It is preferable to have the ears exposed. All photographs must comply with our strict requirements. For more details see: http://jerusalem.usconsulate.gov/photo_requirements.html

Please read all the above carefully and make sure you have all the required visa documents on the day of your visa interview to avoid delays.
