



**The American Consulate General in Jerusalem Announces
Between The Lines: The Writing Experience
University of Iowa
June 25 – July 9, 2016**

Between the Lines (BTL) is a two-week cultural exchange program designed to host 10 writers ages 16 to 19 from Arabic-speaking countries in the Middle East and North Africa. The University of Iowa at Iowa City will host the program, serving as inspiration for the students to grow as writers and providing them with the opportunity to explore cross-cultural dialogues on creative writing and literature. The program is fully sponsored by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) at the U.S. Department of State. These young writers will be immersed in the premier creative writing culture of the United States as part of an exchange that will broaden and sharpen their writing skills, deepen their understanding of American society, and build bridges with young American writers who will participate in creative writing classes alongside the ECA-sponsored writers. Program activities will include writing workshops in both English and Arabic, seminars on literary topics, cultural visits, and other local events along with a trip to Chicago. At the culmination of the program, the students' writings (in both English and Arabic) will be collected into a printed booklet to be used for educational purposes.

The program will also include an educational opportunity for two overseas teachers accompanying the students as chaperones. A substantive creative writing training program created by the IWP will enable the chaperone to further his/her teaching skills during his/her time in the United States.

Requirements for Students:

The program is designed for talented young writers who show promise to become future literary figures in their respective countries and in their own native languages. Students must be between the ages of 16-19 as of June 25, 2016. Students must also be proficient in Arabic and English (reading, writing, and speaking).

All nominees must supply the following:

- A writing sample of 6-8 pages of prose and/or poetry in Arabic.
- A writing sample of 6-8 pages of prose and/or poetry in English. School essays and other non-fiction writing will not be accepted.
- A brief one-paragraph statement of purpose in English describing why writing is important to their life, and what they hope to learn at BTL.
- A writing sample of 2-5 pages of prose and/or poetry in either language in response to one of the following writing prompts:
 - During breakfast you are startled by a heavy knock at the door. It is someone who demands something from you. Who is it, what does he/she need, and what happens next? Write a short story or poem.
 - Write a short story or poem that contains three (3) of the following objects and one (1) place: Objects: old bicycle, uncomfortable couch, leaking canoe, sleeping

puppy, love note, truth serum; Places: cruise ship, forest with a lake, empty street at dawn, deserted dance club.

- The writing samples, writing prompt response, and statement of purpose should all be attached to the email.
- All writing samples must be sent in 12-point font and have one-inch margins all around.

Chaperone application requirements:

- Serve as Arabic-speaking liaisons between the students and the International Writing Program (hosted by the University of Iowa) staff. Chaperones will also work with the International Writing Program on BTL-related projects.
- Be between the ages of 25-40 as of June 21, 2016.
- Demonstrate proficiency in English (reading, writing, and speaking).
- Be a teacher from the students' school who is interested in creative writing and has not had previous exposure to the United States.
- Willing to fully participate in a formal English language program on creative writing teaching methods that will also include American teachers.
- Be reliable, mature, and willing and able to take on the dual responsibilities of their own program and the overall duties of overseeing the students.
- Each nominee must submit a resume/CV and a brief statement of purpose (both in English) describing his or her goals for the program and how his or her participation will benefit the program.
