U.S. Ambassador Susan D. Page invites American citizens to attend a town hall gathering to discuss issues affecting U.S. citizens in South Sudan. The town hall will take place **on Tuesday, November 5** at the U.S. Embassy Residential Compound just off of DDR Avenue, opposite the South Sudan Human Rights Commission. After a briefing by Ambassador Page, she and other Embassy officials will answer questions and meet informally with U.S. citizens.

Please note that the event is open only to U.S. citizens. If you would like to attend, please RSVP to **ACSJuba@state.gov** by noon on Friday, November 1. **Please be advised that all participants must present a valid U.S. Passport – no other IDs will be accepted.** Also note that electronic equipment (cell phones, cameras, laptops, tablets, etc) is not permitted.
