Scholarship Announcement: Civil Society Leadership Award

Award: The Civil Society Leadership Award (CSLA) provides fully-funded scholarships to support studies in the Master of Laws (LL.M.) program at Syracuse University College of Law.

Purpose: CSLA aims to support individuals who demonstrate both academic and professional excellence, and who have the potential to become civil society leaders in their home countries.

Eligibility: Only citizens or permanent residents of the following countries are eligible for the CSLA:

Azerbaijan	Ethiopia	Syria
Belarus	Laos	Turkmenistan
Cambodia	South Sudan	Uzbekistan
Egypt	Sudan	

Structure: Successful candidates will receive the following support:

- Tuition and mandatory school fees
- Monthly stipend for room, board, and other living expenses
- Program-related travel
- Accident/sickness insurance during the program
- Fund for educational materials and professional development
- All costs associated with the CSLA annual conference
- Possible internship support
- Pre-university writing program in July/August
- Note: CSLA does not provide funding for spouses/dependents

Selection: **Deadline to Apply: March 1, 2014.** Criteria for selection will include academic merit and the potential for contributing to the development of civil society in the countries listed above. To apply:

1.
