

ANNUAL ECA ALUMNI PROJECT COMPETITION FY2013 CALL FOR PROPOSALS

SUMMARY

The State Departments' Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs' (ECA) Office of Alumni Affairs invites Alumni to submit proposals for the FY2013 ECA Alumni Project Competition. This annual competition, now in its tenth year, supports efforts to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other nations, and assists exchange program alumni to build on concepts and ideas they explored during their exchange program. **The deadline for submission of project proposals is November 26, 2012.**

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applications must include the following:

- A. Completed project proposal form.
- B. Detailed budget with mandatory cost-sharing.
- C. Adherence to November 26, 2012 deadline.

PROJECT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

A. Projects should support one or more of the following ECA Alumni Program goals:

- 1) To foster alumni implementation and sharing of concepts they explored during their exchange programs;
- 2) To provide training that will improve ability of alumni to implement ideas;
- 3) To involve alumni in recruiting exchange participants, and/or promoting their exchange program, or study in the U.S. especially among non-traditional audiences or in coordination with the EducationUSA advising network; and,
- 4) To enable alumni to work collectively to share the benefits of their exchange experience with home country audiences and to "give back" to the program in which they participated.

B. Projects should involve the global State Alumni website.

All alumni involved in the project should register for the State Alumni website, <https://alumni.state.gov>. Alumni receiving program funds must share their experiences with the global community by posting articles/blogs about ongoing activities on <https://alumni.state.gov>

C. Project proposals should be detailed, demonstrating:

- 1) Clear goals,
- 2) Reliable Partner institutions,
- 3) Transparent evaluation process,
- 4) Realistic timeline and project steps.

D. Project proposals must include a detailed budget, demonstrating:

- 1) Reasonable costs,
- 2) Featured cost-sharing, and that
- 3) Sustainability is achievable once funding has ceased.

PROJECT PROPOSAL FORMAT AND SUBMISSION

Proposals must be submitted using the "FY2013 ECA Alumni Project Competition" proposal and budget forms, available upon request from Albion Abdullaia, abdullaia@state.gov.

FUNDING GUIDELINES

Budget requests cannot exceed USD 20,000. All budgets must be submitted using the budget form (provided upon request).

Cost-sharing and/or in-kind support is mandatory. Applicants are encouraged to take advantage of in-kind support from businesses, universities, NGOs, and other public-private partnership opportunities.

Cost-sharing can also include resources available through the Embassy Public Affairs Section, including the following:

- 1) Existing or donated space for events (i.e. American Corners).
- 2) Donated or borrowed equipment for one-time only events.
- 3) Use of American Fulbrighters, English Language Fellows, or other American visitors in the region to serve as speakers.
- 4) Use of alumni volunteers to assist in project mission (i.e. recruiting new exchange participants, mentoring youth).

Alumni Program funds CANNOT be used:

- 1) To cover representational costs, i.e. receptions.
- 2) To support individual research projects of alumni.
- 3) To pay salaries or administrative overhead for anyone working on the alumni project.

- 4) To pay for international travel outside Macedonia, including travel to/from the United States.
- 5) To pay for speakers traveling from the United States.

Alumni are discouraged from requesting funding for: Alumni websites separate from <https://alumni.state.gov>.

Alumni Program funds CAN be used:

- 1) To cover the reasonable cost of food if it is an integral part of the program.
- 2) To pay for national and regional travel within post's country and region.
- 3) For regional or in-country speakers.

SUSTAINABILITY AND STRATEGY BUILDING

Project proposals lacking a clear progression toward sustainability will be deemed less competitive. As alumni associations expand outreach efforts, they should work toward greater self-reliance. Requests for new activities, however, can be considered for full funding.

Project proposals focused on the areas below will be deemed more competitive:

- **English language;**
- **Youth leadership;**
- **Public/private partnerships;**
- **Democracy and human rights;**
- **Economic opportunity, prosperity, and entrepreneurship;**
- **Women's empowerment;**
- **Promoting a better environment;**
- **Food security;**
- **Global health; and,**
- **Outreach to marginalized communities.**

Sustainable Project Ideas:

ECA welcomes competitive and sustainable project proposals. Support for alumni associations, database development, connecting alumni with NGO partners, utilizing alumni to engage youth, and alumni mentoring programs are just a few examples of competitive and sustainable project ideas.
