

NEVADA TO HOLD A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR CONGRESS – SEPTEMBER 13

On Tuesday, September 13, 2011, Nevada will hold a special election for the 2nd Congressional District, to fill the seat vacated by Representative Dean Heller. The 2nd Congressional District includes all of Nevada with the exception to some parts of Clark County.

Register to Vote and Request Your Ballot Now

If you are not already registered to vote, you may do so by submitting a Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). Your FPCA must be received by your local Nevada Board of Elections Office by August 13, 2011. **Go to FVAP.gov and get started.** If you are already registered to vote, the deadline for submitting an FPCA to request a ballot is September 6, 2011. To find out the status of your registration, you can refer to Nevada's voter registration verification website at: <https://nvsos.gov/votersearch/>. To determine the status of your absentee ballot request, contact your local election office.

If you choose to **email** your FPCA, you should send the form to the email address listed below for the correct county office where you reside in the 2nd Congressional District. If you choose to **fax** your FPCA, fax the form to the fax number listed below for the correct county office where you reside.

Submit your FPCA to the District 2 election office in which you reside

We recommend you mail your voted FWAB or regular State ballot to your County Clerk as soon as possible. A list of addresses for County Clerks may be found at <http://www.nvsos.gov>.

Vote Your Ballot

Your voted ballot must be **received by September 13, 2011 at 7:00pm**, in order to be counted. You must return your voted ballot and signed affidavit by regular mail, or you can send it via a licensed motor carrier such as Federal Express, UPS or DSL. Civilians in Malaysia should contact the U.S. Embassy for specific instructions on how voted ballots, with proper domestic postage attached, can be returned to the United States.

If a voter is concerned about not receiving their ballot in time to vote, they may use the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB, SF-186). The FWAB instructions are available at www.FVAP.gov. The FWAB is also available in embassies and consulates and military installations around the world.
