The United States will celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday on January 20, 2014. This annual Federal holiday occurs every third Monday in January in honor of his legacy. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK), was a pivotal figure in the non-violent Civil Rights Movement in American history and a voice for racial equality and social justice. Dr. King's charismatic leadership had inspired many people of all generations in the United States and around the world.




