U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

▪ The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Manila Regional Office and Outpatient Clinic (VA) is the only VA office located outside United States or its territories. VA has had a presence in the Philippines since 1922, marking its 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the Philippines in 2012.

▪ In 2011, Manila relocated to a new state-of-the-art facility on U.S. Embassy grounds, providing a modern, more accessible VA for Veterans needing services.

▪ VA Manila employs 231 staff. All but ten are Filipino citizens working side by side with their American counterparts to serve Veterans of both countries.

▪ VA has a sizable economic impact on the Philippines and a significant positive impact on the thousands of Veterans and beneficiaries it serves in the Philippines.



▪ VA Manila pays out over \$16 million per month in disability compensation to approximately 15,000 beneficiaries, over half of which are Filipino WW II Veterans or their family members. These monthly payments are in addition to the one-time lump sum payments made to Filipino WW II Veterans and their survivors as part of the Filipino Veterans Equity Compensation Program.

18,530 eligible Filipino WW II Veterans or their survivors have received a total of \$221 million in one-time FVEC payments since 2009. This exceeds the 18,000 Veterans estimated prior to the FVEC benefit becoming law.



- In 2011 VA Manila’s Outpatient Clinic accomplished over 30,000 patient visits and provided world-class health care to thousands of Veterans.

- VA Manila provides foreign aid to the Philippines’ only Veterans hospital, the Veterans Memorial Medical Center, in the form of equipment grants. Since 2003 VA has provided \$6.3 million in equipment grants.



- United States Ambassador Harry K. Thomas, Jr. was the guest of honor during the dedication ceremony of a new \$1.3 million MRI Machine donated by the USDVA to the Veterans Memorial Medical Center (VMMC) in Quezon City on June 29.
