*****If you are able to do the same letter in Spanish (or with the help of a Spanish-speaking family, friend, etc.) that you sign and notarize, please do so as this will speed up the process with Mexican authorities. Otherwise, a consular representative will translate your letter and coordinate with a representative of the Mexican funeral home to request release of the deceased and disposition of the remains. Please note the U.S. Consulate and Consular Agencies normally do not/not provide translation services.**

*****Along with this signed letter you must also send legible proof of your identity (photo ID with your signature).**
