STUDENTS — APPLY FOR A STATE DEPARTMENT PROGRAMS

What could a student internship mean to you at the U.S. Department of State? It's an opportunity for you to get an inside look at the different types of positions and responsibilities available in foreign affairs. You can also gain valuable work experience that will help you in virtually every endeavor, whether you choose to work in government or in the private sector.

At the U.S. Department of State, we like to say we're the face of America to the world. As an intern, you will be, too. Some of our students work in Washington, DC, and others have the opportunity to work at an embassy overseas. Positions are both paid and unpaid, and many are available during spring, summer or fall. U.S. citizens who are still in college and have completed at least 60 credit hours may apply for a Summer internships. There are also a variety of programs for Graduate and High school students as well.

LEAVING MOZAMBIQUE?

If you are leaving Mozambique, and you formally registered your stay with the U.S. Embassy, please be sure to "cancel" your registration when you leave. ELECTION BASICS—ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE ABSENTEE?

Registering online with FVAP as and absentee voter is the first step of the absentee voting process. Voter registration and absentee ballot request can be done at the same time by submitting the [Federal Post Card Application \(FPCA\)](#) and can be easily and automatically completed by using the FPCA wizard at [FVAP.gov](#). If you are already registered to vote and only wish to request a ballot, you should submit your FPCA as soon as possible.



Because election laws vary from state to state, we recommend you consult the website for specific information regarding your state's laws. There are state-by-state procedures for overseas citizens to register and/or request an absentee ballot using the FPCA.

Those wishing to send materials via diplomatic pouch may bring them to the Consular Section at the U.S. Embassy. Voters using the online FPCA or FWAB, and those who are returning a ballot via U.S. postal channels (including diplomatic pouch), may print out the attached prepaid mailing label and tape it to the outside of the envelope in order to take advantage of free postage.
