MISSION

The U.S. President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) proudly supports Mozambique’s fight against HIV/AIDS. With an adult HIV prevalence rate of 11.5%, Mozambique is one of PEPFAR’s 15 priority countries. To date, Mozambique has received approximately \$1.9 billion in PEPFAR funding. These investments support evidence-based interventions in pursuit of an AIDS-free generation, including HIV testing and counseling, voluntary medical male circumcision, the provision of antiretroviral treatment, clinical and community-based care for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA), and more.

PROGRESS

Through these partners, FY13 PEPFAR funds supported the following activities in Maputo Province:

- Anti-retroviral therapy (ART) for nearly **43,459** individuals
- **22,490** voluntary medical male circumcisions
- Anti-retroviral prophylaxis for nearly **9,170** pregnant women to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV
- HIV testing and counseling for **235,678** people
- Care and support to **82,688** Mozambicans, including **8,492** orphans and vulnerable children
- Training for nearly **867** community health workers
- **18** treatment sites, **78** PMTCT sites and **4** male circumcision sites
