### MISSION

The U.S. President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) proudly supports Mozambique’s fight against HIV/AIDS. With an adult HIV prevalence rate of 11.5%, Mozambique is one of PEPFAR’s 15 priority countries. To date, Mozambique has received approximately \$1.9 billion in PEPFAR funding. These investments support evidence-based interventions in pursuit of an AIDS-free generation, including HIV testing and counseling, voluntary medical male circumcision, the provision of antiretroviral treatment, clinical and community-based care for people living with HIV/AIDS

### PROGRESS

Through these partners, FY13 PEPFAR funds supported the following activities in Nampula Province:

- Anti-retroviral therapy (ART) for nearly **28,917** individuals
- **2,668** voluntary medical male circumcision procedures
- Anti-retroviral prophylaxis for **8,813** pregnant women to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV
- HIV testing and counseling for more than **452,591** people
- Care and support to **110,376** Mozambicans, including **48,306** orphans and vulnerable children
- Training for nearly **1,238** community health workers
- **69** treatment sites, **128** PMTCT sites and **1** male circumcision site.
